


The housing emergency in Kent






Key drivers of the housing emergency





What do we need


Four key ingredients needed to build social housing

Homeownership unattainable for many


- Lack of savings for deposits

- Difficulty keeping up with repairs and maintenance



Goldsmith Street, Norwich


- 105 homes for social rent






