






# THE MEDWAY CATCHMENT

## ● Timeline

1. Engagement events with residents to explain details of the scheme – Winter 2016/17
2. Scoping and Full Property Surveys (454 in total) - Spring/Summer 2017
3. Confirm which are suitable for PFR (46 properties are not)
4. Complete pilot scheme of 28 properties (phase 1A) - Dec 2017
5. Flood Exercise for Phase 1A - Spring 2018
6. Commence Phase 1B, detailed design and installation of 256 properties - Winter/Spring 2019
7. Estimate completion of 1B – late Autumn 2019
8. Flood Exercise for 1B – late Autumn 2019

**Flood Warning:**  
Flooding of properties is expected

Take immediate action

Deploy flood barriers, move furniture upstairs, get out of your property to safety.

**SEVERE FLOOD  
WARNING**

SEVERE FLOODING. DANGER TO LIFE.



## Severe Flood Warning:

The flooding has started but is now presenting a high risk to life.

Evacuation is required if feasible and not already undertaken
