Hot Spot Policing

- Hotspot policing 15 min patrols
- Problem solving long term
- To be used before April 1st

It is mandatory that all 43 force areas:

- As a minimum on average, deliver an eligible patrol at least once every three days,
- Ensure patrols are not in direct response to a crime that has just occurred.
- Deploy only high-visibility patrols as eligible for funding..
- Have sufficient analytical capability to support programme.

Terrorism in the UK


- The UK faces a range of different terrorist threats.
- Since 2015 there have been over a dozen attacks in the UK, outside of Northern Ireland, resulting in over 40 fatalities and many more injuries.
- The 2017 attacks alone cost the UK economy over £137m in direct costs and £1.98bn in indirect costs.
- The foremost threat is from Islamist extremist terrorism. But there is also a growing threat from extreme right-wing, left-wing anarchist and single-issue terrorism, and terrorism driven by mixed, unclear and unstable ideologies.
- Since 2017 41 late-stage terrorist plots have been prevented.

- Dover the 'frontline' in the 'migrant battle' and as a result the port attracts a persistent level of protest activity.
- These protests have led to violence between antiimmigrant and antifascist, or pro-refugee groups.
- Organised protests often attract ERW groups
 Self-professed 'citizen journalists' frequently r
 - Self-professed 'citizen journalists' frequently record and livestream arrivals and distribute the videos on social media in an effort to provoke outrage.

- Domestic Abuse was covered in detail at last year's Crime and Disorder Committee
- But has again been raised by Committee members alongside the Violence against Women and Girls (VAWG) priority.
 - So we have combined the two priorities to give you an updates on both...

Domestic Abuse: Reducing Abusive Behaviour & Victim Blaming Language

The Reducing Abusive Behaviour Group helps coordinate approaches and create greater focus on changing the behaviour of the individual causing harm. The group set out two template guides helping organisations respond appropriately to people using abuse.

Responding to clients who may be using abusive behaviour in *their relationships*'

Responding to staff who may be using abusive behaviour in their relationships'

Guides help staff identify signs of abuse, understand parental conflict and typologies of abuse, motivate change and make rereferrals, avoid collusion and deal with counter allegations.

Two free training days delivered by Respect were funded through the Crime Reduction Grants to support confident implementation. Multiagency training on how to tackle victim blaming language sustained the CSPs focus on maintaining accountability with the person being abusive.



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Domestic Abuse: 7 minute learning



Crime Reduction Grants funded development of 5 easily accessible learning videos that can be watched in the time it takes for a quick cup of tea. We want people to feel confident identifying abuse and have the skills to increase people's safety

The videos cover:

- <u>Signs of Abuse</u> Understanding that coercion and control are central to domestic abuse and what this might look like
- <u>Safe Enquiry</u> How to ask about domestic abuse safely and appropriately.
- <u>Safety Planning</u> Making sure that you are able to take some initial steps to increase the client's safety.
- <u>Understanding Risk</u> Covering the factors that increase risk (for instance fear, escalation, strangulation, point of leaving etc) and the implications for information sharing.
- <u>Signposting & Support</u> Being able to signpost people to the right support with confidence.

They have been watched over 3,500 times since being launched in February.





Domestic Abuse: Raising Awareness

The #KnowSeeSpeakOut campaign creates a calendar of social media content that is freely available for organisations across Kent & Medway to utilise.

16 Days of Action Against Domestic Abuse

- Ambassadors with lived experience of abuse shared their stories, these were threaded through the campaign
- a 5.6 million reach for total seen content on social media over the course of the campaign
- 99 organisations shared content
- generated over 700 bookings on the 16 Days webinar series
- featured in a community magazine distributed to 56,000 homes
- displayed posters across the Stagecoach South East bus network
- successfully increased press coverage BBC South East TV feature with a survivor interview, Heart FM breakfast news, KentLive and BBC South East news article


