2. Social Mobility in Grammar Schools Topic Review - to follow *(Item 2)*

(1) The Committee considered a report on the terms of reference, scope, potential witnesses and timescale for the review.

(2) Members made a number of points in relation to the scope of the review which included the following:

- The need to assess the impact of place/area compared to deprivation, i.e. the importance of considering whether disadvantaged groups going to school in non-disadvantaged areas did better than disadvantage groups going to school in a disadvantaged area.
- Included as part of the above was the impact that the primary school's expectations of a child from a deprived background had on the encouragement that they gave that child to take the Kent test.
- Another factor for consideration was the different types of deprivation, not just those who qualified for free school meals, but children could also be disadvantaged by living in a rural area.
- The strong linkage between certain grammar schools and specific primary schools was also a factor to be explored.
- The support give to academically high achieving children in care to take the Kent Test should also be part of the review.
- Whether grammar schools worked with primary schools to address negative perceptions amongst parents and possibly teachers in deprived areas around

the feasibility of children on free school meals and children in care taking the Kent Test.

- Research should be carried out to attempt to establish how children are identified for the Kent Test in deprived areas and the role of the Headteacher and/ or the Headteacher in conjunction with the parent.
- A further factor was the use made of the pupil premium to support pupils with level 5 and high level 4 in preparing for the Kent Test.
- Reference was made to the Birmingham Opening Doors Project where a lower test pass mark was set for children on free school meals. Evidence should be obtained from this project.
- A copy of the “Poor Grammar” report by the Sutton Trust would be circulated to the members of the Committee.

Themes and Questions

Katherine Atkinson, Head of Information and Intelligence (Kent County Council)

- Please introduce yourself and provide an outline of the role and responsibilities of your post
- How many FSM children take up a place in Grammar school compared with non FSM children?
- Have we seen increased numbers of disadvantaged children being put forward for and accessing grammar school education in recent years?
- How do attainment levels differ between FSM children and non FSM children in primary school?
- Are children who are eligible for FSM and who have achieved Level 5 in KS2 as likely to sit and pass the Kent Test as their peers who are not eligible for FSM?
- Is there variation across Kent's districts in the percentage of FSM children who pass the Kent test and take up a place at a Grammar school?
- Does the location of Grammar schools and the competition for places in the West of the county impact on the ability of FSM children to access a Grammar school place?
- Do attainment levels differ between FSM children and non FSM children once in grammar school?
- At Year 11 and beyond, is there a difference in the destinations of FSM children and non FSM children?
- Why do some schools with a high percentage of children on FSM send significantly more children to grammar school, compared to others with a similar demographic with a relatively low number attending?
- Are there any other issues that you would like to raise to the committee?

1. School census pupil context

1.1 There are significantly fewer pupils with Free School Meals (FSM) in Grammar schools than in non-selective schools. The October 2015 school census reports that 12.5 % of children are eligible for FSM in Kent schools, 12.9% in primary and 11.2% in secondary. Nationally, 14.9% of secondary school pupils are eligible for FSM¹. Overall, 2.8% of the pupils in Grammar schools are eligible for FSM, compared to 13.4% in non-selective schools. The proportions vary by year group, and in non-selective schools the numbers reduce significantly in the sixth form. The numbers of Children in Care (CIC) are low in Grammar schools, accounting for just 0.1% (40 children) of the school population. In non-selective schools the numbers are higher, rising to 0.9%. Conversely, Grammar schools have a higher proportion of ethnic minority pupils than non-selective schools, 20.2% compared to 13.9%. (January 2015 figures are included as ethnic minority data is reported annually).

1.2 When looking at the total FSM cohort in secondary schools, 9.8% of the secondary FSM cohort attends grammar schools and 90.2% attends non-selective schools.

2. The Kent Test (Pupils entered in September 2014)

2.1 Entry information for the Kent Test shows that 15.6% of pupils entered for the Kent test are FSM Ever (those that are either currently eligible or have been eligible within the last 6 years) and that they account for 8.3% of those passing the test. Those who are currently eligible account for 7.0% of entries and 3.0% of passes. DfE information about Pupil Premium allocations for 2014-15 showed that nationally, 28.3% of pupils in mainstream secondary schools were eligible for the deprivation Pupil Premium.

2.2 A quarter of the FSM **Ever** pupils that entered the Kent Test also went on to achieve Level 5+ at Key Stage Two (KS2). They accounted for 73.6% of the FSM Ever pupil passes in the Kent Test.

2.5 Independent schools have the highest pass rate for the Kent Test, and for the last three years it has remained at around 70%. However, they account for fewer than 7% of entries, and 10% of passes. The pass rate for Kent schools (excluding independent schools) has remained around 40%, and for out of county schools (excluding independent schools) this figure rises to over 50%. Kent schools (excluding independent schools) account for 69% of entries and 66% of passes.

2.6 For the last three years there has consistently been a difference of over 25 percentage points between the districts with the highest and lowest pass rates for the Kent Test. In the latest year, the lowest pass rate was in Shepway (27.4%), with the highest in Tunbridge Wells (54.4%).

3. Pupil Destinations

3.1 The latest information about pupil destinations from Year 11 in Grammar schools, matched to FSM eligibility, shows that 79% of FSM pupils stay-on into Year 12 school sixth form, compared to over 91% of non-FSM pupils. Most of the FSM pupils not staying in school sixth form chose to attend college, which accounted for an additional 15% of the cohort. Conversely, only 6% of the non-FSM pupils in Grammar schools chose to go to college.

3.2 Pupil destinations information from Year 12 in Grammar schools, matched to FSM eligibility, shows that 64% of FSM pupils stay-on into Year 13, compared to over 80% of non-FSM pupils. Most of the FSM pupils not staying in school sixth form chose to attend college, which accounted for an additional 21% of the cohort. Conversely, only 9% of the non-FSM pupils in Grammar schools chose to go to college.

3.3 The latest information about pupil destinations from Year 13 in Grammar schools, matched to FSM eligibility, shows that 44% of FSM pupils went on to Higher Education (HE), compared to over 60% of non-FSM pupils. Tracking of destinations post Year 13 is more difficult than for Years 11 and 12, so there are higher numbers of pupils with an unknown destination (16% of FSM pupils and 7% of non-FSM pupils). In terms of other destinations, 11% of the FSM pupils chose to attend college compared to 8% of the non-FSM pupils. Thirteen FSM pupils went into employment without training, accounting for 10% of the FSM cohort, but there were 293 non-FSM pupils in this destination group (7%). Percentages taking up apprenticeships from Grammar school were similar for both the FSM and non-FSM groups, at between 3 and 4%.

4. School Level Data

- 4.1 Some primary schools have not entered any FSM pupils for the Kent Test. Of those that have, the percentage of the FSM cohort entered ranges from 6% up to 100%, with subsequent pass rates ranging from 0 to 100%. In the 25 schools where 100% of entered FSM pupils passed, their proportion of the FSM cohort entered for the test ranged from 8% up to 100%, but these were typically cohorts with small numbers of FSM, as the average number of FSM pupils entered across these 25 schools was 1 pupil from an average FSM cohort size of 4. There were 41 schools that entered 100% of their FSM cohort, and these were typically schools with just one FSM pupils in the cohort. However, only 10 of these 41 schools had FSM pupils that passed the test. [See *appendix 1*]
- 4.2 There are 60 schools with 10 or more FSM pupils in their cohorts that entered at least one FSM pupil for the Kent Test. In these schools the percentage of FSM pupils entered ranged from 6% up to 70%. Pass rates in these schools varied from 0% (33 schools) up to 100% (two schools that both entered one FSM pupil). Upton Junior School and Greenfields Community Primary School both have high numbers of FSM pupils and fairly high numbers of those going to grammar school, whilst Drapers Mill Primary Academy and Newington Community Primary School had no FSM pupils going to grammar school despite their high numbers of FSM pupils. [See *appendix 1a*]
- 4.3 There are 55 primary schools in Kent that have consistently narrowed their FSM attainment gap over the last three years. However, there appears to be no correlation between consistent gap-narrowing and a high proportion of FSM pupils passing the Kent Test. [See *appendix 1*]
- 4.4 Of these 55 schools that have consistently narrowed their FSM attainment gap over the last three years, 16 of them (29%) have also shown an increasing proportion of the FSM cohort achieving Level 5+ at KS2 over the last three years. [See *appendix 2*]
- 4.5 The FSM attainment gaps in Grammar schools are significantly smaller than in non-selective schools, though the numbers of pupils with FSM are much lower. The gaps are small for most indicators at the end of KS4, apart from average point scores (APS) which are slightly bigger. However, given the low numbers of FSM pupils the attainment gap information needs to be read carefully as a gap can shift significantly based on the performance of just one pupil. Harvey Grammar and Dover Grammar School for Girls have the best performance in terms of FSM eligibility attainment gap and Norton Knatchbull and Cranbrook have room for improvement. It is also worth noting that in the latest KS4 gap data for Grammar schools, there are three schools with no FSM pupils in their cohort: Tunbridge Wells Girls' Grammar School, Simon Langton Girls' Grammar School and Tonbridge Grammar School. [See *appendix 3*]

Biography

Patrick Leeson – Corporate Director Education and Young People Services - KCC

Patrick Leeson is Corporate Director for Education and Young People's Services, for Kent County Council. He has been a member of the Advisory Groups for reviews of the Teacher Standards and the National Curriculum, and was on the steering group for the Tickell Review of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Roger Gough – Biography

Roger Gough is Cabinet Member for Education and Health Reform, and has served in a variety of Cabinet roles since 2006. He has served as the Conservative Member for Darent Valley since 2005. He has chaired the Kent Health and Wellbeing Board since it was established in shadow form in September 2011.

He worked in investment banking for sixteen years until 2002, mainly as an investment analyst specialising in the banking industry. From 1988 to 1991, Mr Gough lived and worked in Tokyo as an analyst of the Japanese financial sector; he was subsequently an analyst of the European banking industry.

He was a Research Director of Policy Exchange from 2006 – 2009 and served as Rapporteur to Ken Clarke's Democracy Task Force from 2006 – 2008. He has written widely on policy issues, chiefly constitutional and local government matters. His study of international comparisons in local government 'With a Little Help from Our Friends' was published by Localis in 2009.

His first book, 'A Good Comrade: János Kádár, Communism and Hungary' was published in September 2006. For this book he was awarded the Knights Cross of the Order of Merit of the Republic of Hungary.

His second book, 'Account Rendered' (co-authored with Stuart McCracken and Andrew Tyrie MP) was published by Biteback in July 2011. It examines Britain's role in the transfer of terror suspects for the American government.

All Members are welcome to ask these questions or pose additional ones to the witnesses via the Committee Chairman.

Themes and Questions

Patrick Leeson, Corporate Director – Education and Young People's Services
(Kent County Council)**

- Please introduce yourselves and provide an outline of the role and responsibilities of your posts.
- Less than 3% of all pupils going to Grammar schools are entitled to FSM, against 13% in non-selective schools in Kent. This is compared to Northern Ireland, for example, where 7% of pupils on FSM attend Grammar schools. Why is this?
- Why are academically high achieving FSM children less likely to apply for and secure a place at a Grammar school than their non-FSM peers, despite the fact they may have a high KS2 test result?
- How is Pupil Premium funding being used to narrow the gap and has it been successful to date?
- What steps are being taken to identify children on FSM as early as KS1 who should be entered for the Kent Test and how is the Pupil Premium used to support their journey to grammar education?
- Is the increased numbers of free schools and academies in Kent having any bearing on parents and children choosing selective or non-selective education?
- What changes has Kent made to improve fair access for low income families to grammar schools? For example, testing, test preparation, outreach, admissions or collaborations. And, what impact have these had?
- How can Grammar schools in Kent open themselves up to more disadvantaged students and increase the proportion of FSM and CIC pupils on their rolls? For example, through giving priority to academically high achieving pupils applying for admission, who are in receipt of the Pupil Premium?
- How can KCC influence the proportion of FSM and CIC children accessing Grammar schools given that individual schools, and particularly Academy Grammar schools, have their own admissions policies?
- The Sutton Trust has reported that parents from disadvantaged backgrounds often associate their schools with tradition, middle class values and elitism, creating a social rather than an educational barrier to make them reluctant to send

their children to the local grammar. Do you think this is true and if so, how can we mitigate this perception?

- How can KCC, in partnership with schools, support children, parents and schools to ensure fairer access to a Grammar school education for FSM children and Children in Care?
- Who decides if a child in care should take the Kent Test?
- Are there any other issues that you would like raise with the Committee?
