- (c) appoint Mr D Farrell as the Labour Group's representative on the University of Kent Court. The remaining 5 vacancies would be filled by the Conservative Group (4 representatives) and the Liberal Democrat Group (1 representative) and notified to the Head of Democratic Services.

Introduction

1. In accordance with paragraph 15 of The Local Authorities (Members' Allowances) (England) Regulations 2003, Kent County Council is required to publish annually the allowances paid to Members, which includes the Basic, Special Responsibility, Travelling and Subsistence, Dependent Carers and Co-optees Allowances. The Committee will also be aware of the legal requirement for the County Council to have a Member Remuneration Panel to advise the Council on the level of allowances and expenses Members should receive.

Details for 2016/17

- 2. The schedule of Members' Allowances and Expenses for the period 1 April 2016 to 31 March 2017 is attached as **Appendix A**. The total gross cost (including VAT) of all allowances and expenses for Members in 2016/17 is £1,744,978 which represents a £22,860 decrease in total costs compared to 2015/16 of £1,767,838. As the VAT element can be reclaimed, Member's allowances and expenses have been reported monthly throughout the year on a net basis (excluding VAT) in order to demonstrate the true cost to the authority.
- 3. At its meeting on 13 July 2011, this Committee agreed that the costs incurred by Members using the County Cars and taxis that were booked directly by KCC should also be reported on an annual basis. The total net cost of the County Car service in 2016/17 was £35,749, compared to £48,178 in 2015/16, as detailed in **Appendix B**.

1. Introduction

(1) Greater use of technology and the digitalisation of operations and information continues to be one of the key drivers for building capacity, developing efficiency and driving out savings.

- 4. The beneficiaries of the scheme are recipients under the age of 25, living in the Parish of Shorne, who are "in need of financial assistance."

Kent County Council provides elected Members to serve on a number of such charities. These are normally Local Members. In this instance, the Local Member is Mr Bryan Sweetland who has indicated that he would like to recommend that Dr Craig is invited to serve in this capacity. Dr Craig has agreed to do so if asked.

PAGE'S EDUCATIONAL TRUST

I wrote to you at about this time last year, but had no reply, to ask if KCC could nominate a Trustee for the above charity, registered with The Charity Commission (307660), which was set up by the bequest of Lady Eleanor Page who died in 1645 for:

- Recipients under the age of 25;
- Living in the Parish of Shorne;
- Who are 'in need of financial assistance'

for the purposes of:

- Providing clothing, tools, instruments or books for the beneficiaries on leaving school or any other educational establishment to prepare for, or to enter, a profession, trade or calling;
- Accessing opportunities at secondary schools, colleges or universities not otherwise provided for;
- Otherwise promoting the education (including social and physical training) of beneficiaries.

The 'Scheme of Operation' registered with The Charity Commission, was last updated in 1968, and requires a membership as follows:

- Chair The Vicar of Shorne;
- Three members appointed by Shorne Parish Council;
- One member appointed by KCC;
- Up to two additional members co-opted by the Trustees.

Assets are currently in the region of £15,000 and Trustees are required to meet at least twice a year. We have now regularised this as April and October, meeting during the day at Shorne School. Meetings usually take no longer than an hour. The regulations say that should any Trustee miss two meetings in a row, they are disqualified.

In the current absence of a Vicar (an interregnum exists) the Charity currently has only three Trustees – all appointed by Shorne Parish Council, so we are anxious to increase our numbers.

We understand that there are many demands of KCC Members' time and do not expect that you will be able to appoint one to this very small charity. However, in that event, would you be able to nominate somebody else — preferably with a local (Shorne) connection. If not, would the Council be prepared to appoint me as its representative, thus vacating my Parish Council nominated place for another? As an ex-senior officer of KCC I am sure that Paul Carter or another Cabinet Member (for example John Simmonds) would provide a reference for me if required.

FOR DECISION

- 1. The Superannuation Fund Committee currently has 3 District Council co-optees with full voting rights and 1 Medway Council co-optee who does not have voting rights.
- 2. In 2015 the Superannuation Fund Committee considered a number of reports to address the historical anomaly in the way in which the District Council co-optees were appointed and also the lack of voting rights for the Medway Council co-optee.
- 3. In November 2015 the Committee agreed that in future any vacancies for District Council co-optees would be filled by a Kent Leaders Group nominee. Regarding voting rights for the Medway Council co-optee, the Committee decided that it would be more appropriate to address this after the 2017 Election when the new Committee's political proportionality had been determined.
- 4. Following consideration at the County Council meeting on 25 May 2017 the proportionality on this Committee was agreed as follows 8 Conservative and 1 Liberal Democrat. It is therefore now possible to give voting rights to the Medway Council co-optee and comply with the requirement for the KCC administration group to have a majority on this Committee. This will be taken into account whenever Committee proportionality is reviewed.

RECOMMENDATION:

6. That the Medway Council co-optee on the Superannuation Fund Committee be granted full voting rights.
