## 2. Declarations of Interests by Members in items on the Agenda for this meeting.

### 3. Member Role Descriptions

(Item 3)

- 1) The report was introduced by Senior Governance Manger, Mr Tristan Godfrey. It was explained that the substantive content of the role descriptions were currently being reviewed by the Governance Working Party and would also be considered by the Member Remuneration Panel. The purpose of the current report was to improve their accessibility.
- 2) Members asked questions and discussed the report. The main points were that:

### Overall Summary

318 grants were awarded in 2023/24, the total amount of funding awarded was £351,970.98

Following concerns raised by the local Parish Council regarding vehicle speeds along the A28 through Bilting and Godmersham, 14 x 50mph roundels were introduced as part of grant funding.

## Installation of a 30mph limit – Church Road, Warehorne £2,669.03

Warehorne Parish Council approached the local Member and requested the implementation of a 30mph speed limit through the village, along Church Road. Traffic surveys were conducted which supported the scheme and Traffic Regulation Order was implemented. Grant funding contributed to the final cost of the scheme.

Highways (23-KHS-AS-8) Salt Bin – Minnis Gate £414.63

A salt bin was supplied, installed and filled at Minnis Gate to enable the community to use salt on the public highway during the winter period.

### Highways (23-KHS-AS-19)

## New Footway (phase 1) - Faversham Road, Challock £5000

The local Member was approached by Challock Parish Council expressing concerns regarding a lack of footway on Faversham Road, Challock. Due to the cost of the scheme, delivery will be in two phases.

Phase 1 included the felling of a tree, land acquisition, hedge clearing and installation of approximately 80m of footway. Grant funding was provided as a contribution, with further contributions from the Parish and Borough Councils.

A Fun Day for people with a learning disability in Herne Bay was organised where they could highlight their skills and socialise with other service users. Grant funding contributed to communication materials and resources for the day.

Grant funding was provided to enhance the school's Early Years area through the purchase of a reading shed, stage and backdrop.

### 312 (City of Canterbury) Squadron RAFAC (23-CA-21) First Aid Training and Paddle sport introduction £1,000

As part of the squadron's aims 'to develop the qualities of good citizenship and leadership in young people' and 'to foster a spirit of adventure,' funding contributed to the purchase of a Resuscitation Annie, including two replacement lungs and Stand-Up Paddleboards.

### Canterbury Unit 67 of the Sea Cadet Corps (23-CA-25) Modernise the unit's accessible wet room £1,000

The Unit requested funding to modernise its accessible wet room for the unit and the local community. Funding provided waterproof screen/white rock.

### All Saints Church Food Larder (23-CA-31) Christmas Day Lunch and entertainment £1,000

Grant funding contributed to the food for 150 meals served at the Baptist Church which provided a warm and safe place for those that found themselves alone at Christmas.

Grant funding was requested to contribute to the purchase of secure fencing and a lockable gate at the site of the Abbott's Mill Project to ensure that the community peace garden is safe at night, and anything planted is not damaged or destroyed.

## Canterbury Climate Action Partnership (CCAP)(23-CA-17) Outreach Project

### £500

A pilot project was launched to reach out to those people living in Canterbury's most deprived wards to help them with the current cost of living crisis and to address climate change by making some adjustments to their lives. Grant funding contributed to staffing costs and information booklets for attendees.

### Kentish Stour Countryside Partnership (23-CA-36) Shipping Container, racking and electrics £1000

The partnership's old shipping container was very badly corroded and needed replacing. To ensure that the new container remains secure and has suitable storage, grant funding contributed to a lock box, racking, secure padlock and electrics.

### Kent Farmers Market Association (23-CA-37) – <u>Multi Member Application</u> Website Expansion

### £300 (Total award - £1950)

The Association proposed to extend the format of its website with a new section to enable customers to find local producers who do not necessarily attend Farmers Markets. These suppliers

will be displayed on a map of Kent (by produce category) so viewers will be able to find them and link directly to their web sites/shop. Grant funding contributed to software and design costs.

### Alan Marsh

### Deal Memorial Bandstand Trust (23-CA-4) – <u>Multi Member Application</u> Royal Marines Band Concert on Walmer Green £700 (£1200 Total Award)

As part of its summer concert season, the Band of His Majesty's Royal Marines performed at the memorial concert and rededication service. Grant funding contributed to the costs of LED Screens.

### Hearing Dogs for Deaf People (23-CA-6) Outdoor Event Equipment £500

Hearing Dogs for Deaf People's 'Placement Instructors' (an instructor that is assigned to each Hearing Dog recipient) hold regular community days so that recipients can receive ongoing training. Grant funding contributed to the purchase of a gazebo and tables.

### Herne and Broomfield Parish Council (23-CA-8) Community Fun Day £360

Due to the cost of living, a free community event was held with low-cost activities for the local community to come together, including dog and classic car shows. Grant funding contributed to first aid and bin hire.

### £2,000

Following the failure of the Association's main hall heating, a replacement was needed to ensure continued use of facilities. Grant funding contributed to the cost of a new combi boiler.

Grant funding provided subsidised tickets and transport for the Year 3 class to attend a local pantomime.

- a) The Aylesham and District Community Workshop Trust is a charity that has been serving the Aylesham Community since 1996. The organisation provides grants to voluntary organisations in the area, from funds they have raised themselves.
