#### LIST OF FORTHCOMING EXECUTIVE DECISIONS

Each week the list of Forthcoming Executive Decisions is updated where there are additions, deletions or amendments to be made. Although Kent County Council aims to include all known decisions, statute requires that all Key decisions must be publicised in this way.

A "Key Decision" is an Executive-side Decision which is likely to:

- (a) result in the council incurring expenditure which is, or the making of savings which are, significant having regard to the council's budget for the service or function to which the decision relates; or
- (b) be significant in terms of its effects on communities living or working in an area comprising two or more electoral divisions in the area of the local authority.

Key Decisions can only be taken by the Cabinet, the Leader or an individual Cabinet Member.

Decisions which should be regarded as Key Decisions because they are likely to have a significant effect either in financial terms or on the Council's services to the community include:

- (a) Decisions about expenditure or savings over £1,000,000
- (b) Adoption of major new policies not already included in the Policy Framework (Constitution Appendix 3) or changes to established policies
- (c) Approval of management and business plans
- (d) Decisions that involve significant service developments, significant service reductions, or significant changes in the way that services are delivered, whether County-wide or in a particular locality. For example, closure of a school, approval of a major project (such as a highway scheme) or programme of works, major changes in the eligibility criteria for provision of a service, major changes in the fees charged for a service, or proposals that would result in a service currently provided inhouse being outsourced.
- (e) Decisions where the consequences are likely to result in compulsory redundancies or major changes in the terms and conditions of employment of a significant number of employees in any of the Council's functions.

Preparation of the list helps the Council to programme its work and ensures compliance with the 'Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) regulations 2012.

The list outlines the consultation that is proposed in respect of future decisions and who members of the public and the Council should contact to make comments on any particular item. Anyone is entitled to obtain copies of the documents that will be relied upon when a decision is taken, unless those documents are 'Exempt' within the meaning of the relevant sections of the Local Government Act 1972 (as amended).

Once the decision has been taken, a copy of the Record of Decision will also be published on the Council's website. Broomhill Primary School, Tunbridge Wells - Expansion			

This decision will be taken in two parts. Part 1 has been approved and implemented – to issue the public notice. Part 2, 14/00042(b), key decision to allocate funds, will be taken following completion of the statutory FED publication period.

It is proposed to enlarge Broomhill Bank School by 56 places increasing the designated number of places to 136 for the September 2014.

It is proposed that KCC funded improvements to the school will provide all necessary teaching rooms including specialist teaching spaces. Facilities within the school will be improved and designed to meet the needs of students. A feasibility study has been completed. The total cost is estimated to be in the region of £2 million of which £1.75 million will be funded from Targeted Basic Need and the remainder from the Basic Needs and Special Schools Review Budget. The costs of the project are estimates and these may increase as the project is developed. If the cost of the project is greater than 10% the Cabinet Member will be required to take a further decision to allocate the additional funding.

Revenue - The schools delegated budget will be allocated on an agreed number of commissioned places in accordance with the High Needs funding methodology of 'Place Plus'. Human – Broomhill Bank School will appoint additional teachers, as the school size increases and the need arises.

#### **FURTHER INFORMATION**

The decision by KCC to offer, on a discretionary basis, temporary funding for people unable to access funds (usually because they are tied up in property) is directly compatible with Kent's Bold Step to "tackle disadvantage". It is also in line with the corporate objective of supporting people to access the care and support they need. The current official policy is that an individual must wait until their liquid assets have reduced to £3,000 before they become eligible for TFA. This threshold has not changed for several years and it is now thought to be too low, particularly for people whose weekly income is low. For such people there may not be enough time for KCC to process the necessary agreement and to take over the contract with the home.

**Financial Implications**: It is not possible to predict accurately the financial implications of the proposed change to the policy. Finance believes it will provide a longer period to arrange for a charge to be placed on the resident's property before KCC begins funding. This is a good thing as it ensures our debt is secure. There are currently less than 100 people receiving TFA. The numbers are not expected to increase due to this change, rather people will be able to start the process of getting help earlier.

**Legal Implications**: The revision to the policy is entirely in line with KCC's duties under the National Assistance Act 1948, in particular sections 21 and 22.

**Equality Implications**: The proposed change will benefit all service users.

#### SIMS Software Procurement

#### **FURTHER INFORMATION**

Following a joint EU compliant procurement with East Sussex, Surrey and Brighton and Hove Councils, the ICT Division would like to procure the SIMS MIS software for Kent maintained schools and establishments to allow the continued use of the software for school MIS purposes including the statutory returns required by the Department for Education.

The SIMS MIS system has been used in schools for many years and has remained the schools preferred MIS solution despite other alternatives being available on the market.

Various Kent support units e.g. Kent EiS, Kent Schools Personnel Service, Kent Schools Finance, currently offer services to schools and academies based around the use of the SIMS MIS software and this forms part of the overall business plan for these various units and their Directorate.

Kent, on behalf of its maintained schools and establishments, currently pays Capita Children's Services Limited approximately £500,000 per year (or approximately £4.00 per pupil) for the use of the SIMS MIS software under the Kent LA SIMS License.

The amount paid under this procurement arrangement does not include academies which are not permitted by the software vendor to acquire the SIMS MIS software through the Kent LA SIMS Licence and as such have to make their own licensing arrangements.

The expenditure incurred is de-delegated from the schools delegated funding and is subject to the agreement of the Schools Funding Forum each year. The number of schools covered by the licence is reviewed annually to ensure Kent is not paying for schools that have converted to academy status and if a school converts to an academy part way through a financial year a credit is claimed from the software vendor for the period from the academy's conversion date to the end of the financial year.

Kent, on behalf of its maintained schools and establishments, currently pay Capita Children's Services Limited approximately £500,000 per year (or approximately £4.00 per pupil) for the use of the SIMS MIS software under the Kent LA SIMS License.

The amount paid under this procurement arrangement does not include academies which are not permitted by the software vendor to acquire the SIMS MIS software through the Kent LA SIMS Licence and as such have to make their own licensing arrangements.

The expenditure incurred is de-delegated from the schools delegated funding and is subject to the agreement of the Schools Funding Forum each year.

The number of schools covered by the license is reviewed annually to ensure that Kent is not paying for schools that have converted to academy status and if a school converts to an academy part way through a financial year a credit is claimed from the software vendor for the period from the academy's conversion date to the end of the financial year.

By doing this procurement for all Kent maintained schools and establishments under the Kent LA SIMS Licence arrangements, the cost for the continued use of the SIMS MIS software for these schools is considerably lower when compared to what an individual school would be required to pay for the same software as a single school (approximately £10.00 per pupil).

This procurement will allow schools the continued use of the software for a period of up to seven years and will remove any risk to the authority of being challenged over the continued use of the software by Kent maintained schools and establishments without a suitable procurement having been put in place.

Public Health completed a consultation to find out what mothers value most about infant feeding services and what they would want a new service to provide. Respondents indicated that they valued having a local specialist service to support breastfeeding in the early days and weeks after they have given birth. They also valued the support and advice from peer supporters who were approachable and available at community venues such as Children's Centres.

A market engagement exercise, conducted alongside the consultation, highlighted a good level of interest for a county wide service to support infant feeding. Providers supported the proposal for a countywide community infant feeding service which would have responsibility for improving breastfeeding rates across the county by providing a consistent level of support for new mothers including lactation specialists and peer supporters. Providers who participated in the market engagement process also welcomed the expectation of close working and co-location with children's centres.

The Children's Social Care and Health Cabinet Committee agreed to support the tendering exercise at their meeting of 2nd May 2014. The results of the tender exercise, and therefore this decision, will be discussed at the meeting of the Children's Social Care and Health Cabinet Committee on 9th July 2014.

The project is in line with Kent Corporate Objectives and in particular supports the following Bold Steps for Kent priorities to:

Help the Kent Economy grow: the construction cost value to the Kent economy will be a minimum of c£13.35m based on the SCAPE KPI of 70% of the capital value being spent in the local area.

Putting the Citizen in Control: there is currently no selective education provision within the Sevenoaks district, this puts the parents in the Sevenoaks area at a disadvantage as they need to travel out of district to selective provision in Tonbridge or Tunbridge Wells areas. The Education Commissioning plan uses a district-wide model to provide consistency with the twelve district councils. The forecasts for selective schools most preferred for the Sevenoaks South population, 12 schools in number, all indicate a steady increase in demand for Year 7 places over the next 10 years. Therefore it has been calculated that demand for a selective school in the Sevenoaks area is required to meet the statutory basic need of education places. To tackle disadvantage: Currently 1150 students travel outside of the Sevenoaks district to access Selective education each day. Whilst there is capacity for these students in neighbouring districts it does not avoid the need for all of these students to attend school in their local district area. (There could be a limited case to increase the size/capacity of the schools in neighbouring districts, but the estimated capacity of these schools will be absorbed by the increases in student numbers expected directly within these districts by 2018).

#### **FURTHER INFORMATION**

Growing Places Fund (GPF) is a Government scheme which provides loan finance to unlock development sites where these will create new jobs and homes. In the South East, the Fund is administered by the South East Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP), for which Essex County Council acts as the accountable body.

Following a call for projects and appraisal, the LEP has given indicative approval to allocate up to £8 million over five years for a rolling programme of capital investment.

This Decision contributes to delivery of the following Delivering Bold Steps priorities:

Priority 8: Respond to key regeneration challenges, working with our partners. This specifically prioritises actions to unlock key sites, where these will lead to jobs and housing

**Impact:** The proposed Decision will mean that KCC will be able to draw down Growing Places Fund investment of up to £8 million. It is anticipated that this will contribute to the safeguarding of up to 2,000 jobs at Discovery Park by supporting the Enterprise Zone's continued viability and attractiveness to investors.

**Risks:** GPF funding is repayable. The primary risk is that KCC will be liable to repay the GPF loan to the Accountable Body, even if Discovery Park Ltd is unable to repay. This will be mitigated through due diligence, the robust drafting of the credit agreements, and project monitoring.

**Costs:** There will be some costs to KCC in managing the credit agreement. These will be recovered through interest payments and/ or through recharges to the central GPF fund, with costs and recovery mechanisms considered in development of the credit agreement.

# How the decision relates to BS4K and Corporate Objectives:

This will contribute to the delivery of Priority 5, specifically:

- The 'Kent Environment Strategy' EF1.1: We will simplify the energy and water efficiency support landscape for Kent residents and support development of and access to, finance mechanisms such as the Green Deal and Energy Company Obligation (ECO)
- Build a strong relationship with key business sectors across Kent (this will support the growth of the low carbon sector in Kent)

- Setting up the framework also enables Kent authorities to work with successful suppliers to offer part or

fully funded energy efficiency measures to private residents through joint communications and use of our own trusted brands

- KCC's involvement is as lead authority to establish the framework; it is anticipated that KCC will facilitate the delivery of measures to private residents but has little or no stock of its own to improve.
- Should KCC choose to utilise the framework for improvements to its own stock or to support the
  installation of measures in private (vulnerable) residents properties through a financial contribution, the

# **Lorry Park Network (Phase 1)**

To determine the preferred site for the delivery of the first lorry park (Phase 1) of a network of lorry parks across Kent, based on the detailed evidence to be provided and once determined approve:

- a) the work to undertake land acquisition, including commencing the Compulsory Purchase Order process;
- b) the undertaking of a public consultation exercise on the preferred site later in 2014, and;
- c) Commencement of project development work and submission of a planning application.

This project directly supports the strategic aims of KCC:

- i. It 'helps the Kent economy to grow': it will encourage inward investment in to East Kent, improve business productivity by alleviating congestion and unreliability (avoiding a loss of £1m/day during Operation Stack) and reduce wastage of public money associated with managing Operation Stack and dealing with inappropriate overnight lorry parking. Kent's Business Advisory Board states the impact of Operation Stack on their businesses is substantially negative and therefore it is hoped that the improvements described will also help to tackle the perception that Kent is not open for business, currently an unwanted misconception that occurs as a result of the national publicity that Operation Stack receives.
- ii. It 'tackles disadvantage': by reducing accidents, improving quality of life for Kent's residents, reducing illegal and unsuitable lorry parking (including overnight parking) in Kent, improving drivers' dignity and helping them to follow the EU Drivers Hours Directive, improving the perceptual image of East Kent from a tourism perspective and reducing the amount of public resources diverted to the management of Operation Stack.

# Thanet Parkway Railway Station - Project Development and Delivery

To approve next steps for developing Thanet Parkway project involving:

- a) the work to undertake land acquisition, including commencing the Compulsory Purchase Order process;
- b) the undertaking of public consultations this and next financial years, and;
- c) the commencement of development work and submission of planning application.

The project is outlined as a priority within Growth without Gridlock (2010-30), the Local Transport Plan (2011-16) and the Rail Action Plan for Kent (2011) and will address Kent County Council's key objectives.

The project will 'help the Kent economy to grow': it will unlock development in East Kent and boost Kent's economy by improving rail accessibility to key employment sites such as the Discovery Park Enterprise Zone, Manston Business Park, Eurokent Business Park, Westwood Cross and China Gateway.

The Thanet District Council Core Strategy Options Consultation (2013) identifies the district's intension to deliver 7,500 houses by 2026. In order to support this level of development rail accessibility will need to be improved, as limited car parking capacity at Ramsgate station currently restricts its ability to cater for additional demand. The Parkway station would enable delivery of more than 2,000 new houses and 5,000 new jobs in East Kent by improving connectivity and accessibility to key development areas and improving perceptions of the area.

The project will help to 'tackle disadvantage and unemployment' in East Kent: The Parkway station

itself is located in Thanet, where 15,200 households were recorded as living in poverty in 2010 and unemployment at 5.7% (June 2013), significantly higher than Kent's average unemployment rate of 2.8% (June 2013). The scheme will enable key employment areas to be reached by public transport, which are currently only accessible by private car. The Parkway station will increase employment opportunities for Thanet residents to London and other locations in the county such as Ashford and will bring London to within 1 hour travel time opening up significant inward investment opportunities for Thanet.

**Financial Implications**: £10 million grant funding is being sought from the Single Local Growth fund; discussions are taking place with Network Rail and the private sector to fill any funding gap to deliver the Parkway station. The business case work has been completed, showing that the project offers high value for money and the station is commercially viable (net fares revenue is in excess of the ongoing cost). Depending on the operating model, there is the potential for the station car park to provide a future income to KCC over a number of years.

**Legal Implications**: Legal advice will be sought throughout the development of this project to prepare agreements with Network Rail and ensure we are complying with the necessary UK and EU regulations in delivering a commercial car park at the station.

**Equality Implications**: An Equality Impact Assessment has been carried out for this project and will be attached with the July 2014 Cabinet Committee report.

The matter is agreed as part of the Council's annual budget for 2014-15 at page 32, row reference 12.

If the cost of the project is greater than 10% the Cabinet Member will be required to take a further decision to allocate the additional funding.
- b. Revenue For a period of three academic years from September 2015, the school will receive protection for an additional 30 Reception Year pupils at the rate of £2,727 per pupil. For each additional classroom, resulting from the expansion of the school, the sum of £6,000 will allocated towards the classroom setup costs.
- c. Human Rose Street School will appoint additional teachers, as the school size increases and the need arises.

In particular, a new clause has been added to the Agreement; "subject to the agreement of the Chairman, additional representatives from Parish/Town Councils may attend but may neither vote nor propose a motion nor an amendment".

This reflects the current variation in practice within JTBs and the desire to have one flexible Agreement covering all JTBs rather than individual bespoke arrangements.

The transport strategies to be agreed all form part a key part of evidence base for the relevant Local Plan. KCC will not be the charging authority therefore it will be reliant on each local council as the planning authority to allocate sufficient CIL revenue to the priority transport infrastructure projects identified in the strategy. The availability of CIL revenue will in turn be dictated by the phasing and extent of new development which will be influenced by a range of external factors.
