Summary and recommendations of equality analysis/impact assessment.

Context

As part of the Kent Resilience Forum, KCC has been working closely with the Department for Transport (DfT), Kent Police and Highways England, along with many other stakeholders, to establish plans to manage freight in Kent following the end of Transition on the 31st December 2020.

As part of this work, the Government identified the need for sites to provide Customs checks together with additional traffic management and freight holding areas. The first site at Sevington, adjacent to J10a, M20 was commenced in July 2020 and is being used by DfT and HMRC.

From July 2021, further customs clearance checks by DEFRA will be required and the DfT have purchased land at White Cliffs Business park, Whitfield near Dover to build another Inland Border Facility from which HMRC & DEFRA will operate.

Aims and Objectives

The project is to support a Government programme to ensure the UK has infrastructure in place to manage the required customs checks within easy reach from the Port of Dover and Eurotunnel.

Summary of equality impact

This EqIA is for the construction of a site at White Cliffs Business Park adjacent to the A2 in Whitfield, near Dover to allow HMRC and DEFRA to carry out customs checks for inbound and outbound freight using the Port of Dover. KCC's role is to manage construction of the site. Initially, works will include:

- construction of an enclosed site to include a Border Control Post (BCP) to allow for customs checks to be undertaken.
- preparing the site in readiness for construction
- undertaking work to protect or relocate existing utilities
- creating a site entrance and junction adjacent to B&Q in the White Cliffs Business Park and associated highway works
- creating a base for future buildings using cut and fill on site under guidance of the Environment Agency
