Decision - Domestic Abuse Act - New Burdens Funding

As Leader of the Council, I agree to:

- 1) Accept the £3.1m Domestic Abuse Act funding for use in line with the Memorandum of Understanding issued by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG).
- 2) Delegate authority to the Corporate Director of Strategic and Corporate Services, in consultation with the Corporate Director of Adult Social Care & Health and the Corporate Director for Children, Young People and Education to take other necessary actions, including but not limited to entering into contracts or other legal agreements, as required to implement this decision.

Reason(s) for decision:

Although the Domestic Abuse Bill is still going through the Parliamentary process, the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) has allocated £3.1m to KCC to implement the new duties from 1 April. A decision is needed to accept the funding. Further work is underway to assess how the funding will be allocated, in line with the grant conditions.

Financial Implications:

The decision is to accept the £3.1m in full, and there should be no direct impact on the council's budget.

Reason for Urgency:

MHCLG only notified us of the funding on 3rd March, and a key decision is needed to accept the funding. Also, although the allocation of most of the funding will be determined by a needs assessment, some of the funding is required from 1 April to pay for the staff who are implementing the new arrangements.

Member and other consultation:

No Cabinet Committee consultation possible due to urgency process.
