Start of Cinque Ports Phase 5 shared use foot and cycleway on the southeast side of <u>A259 Dymchurch</u> <u>Road</u>, opposite the junction with <u>Nickolls Road</u>, Palmarsh and heading southwest.



All lamp columns, utility poles, signs and posts on the southeast side of the road to be relocated to the rear of the new shared use foot and cycleway along the entire length of the route.



Centre islands and centre lane near to the quarry entrance to be removed to enable the verge to be widened to incorporate the new 3 metres wide shared use foot and cycleway.



Bus stop layby on southeast side of road to be removed and replaced with a 3 metres wide shared use footway / cycle route. New bus stop border to be installed in the carriageway.



Junction with **Botolph's Bridge Road**.

Retaining wall to be installed around **Dymchurch Redoubt** to give space for the new shared use foot and cycleway.



End of proposed scheme where pedestrians and cyclists can continue their journey westwards on the seawall through to Dymchurch village centre, New Romney and Lydd.
