

# Resilience and Emergency Planning Service

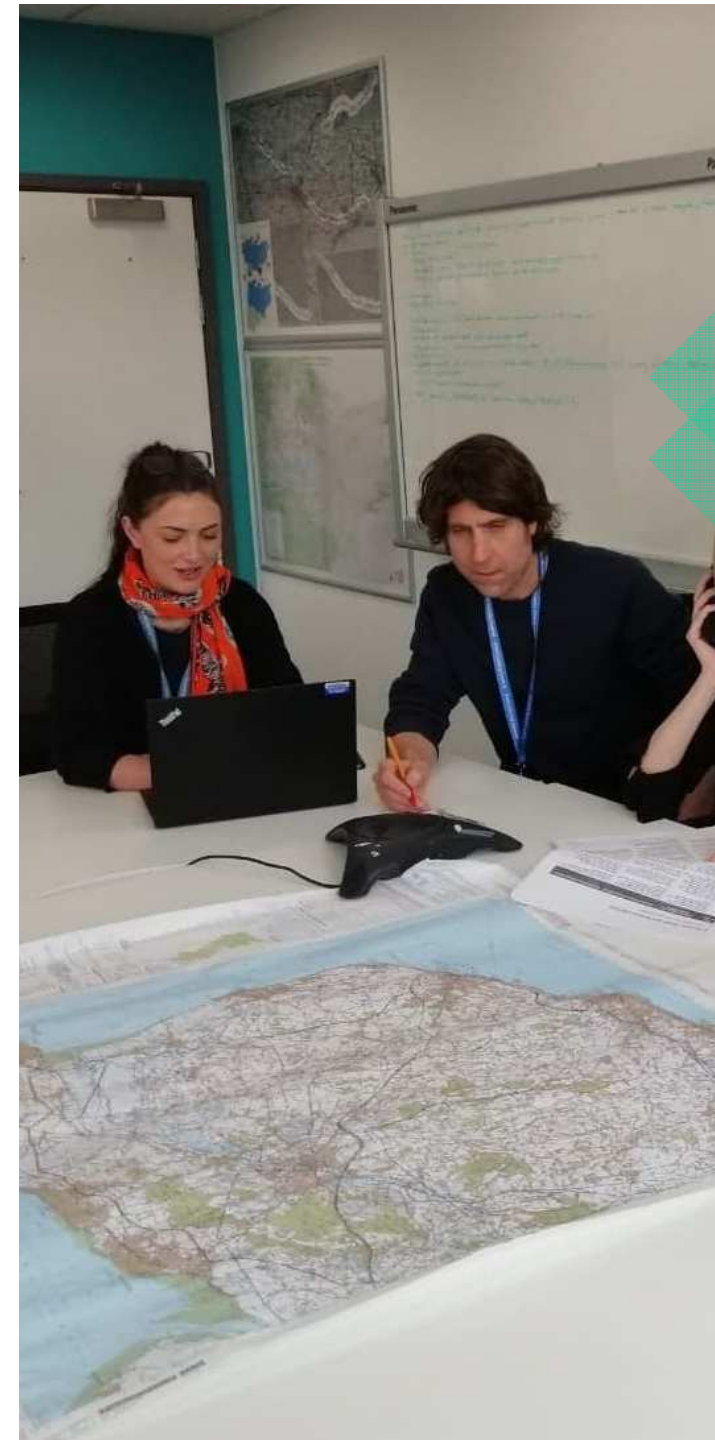
Ensures the County Council evidences Legal and Regulatory compliance with Civil Contingencies Act 2004 and 50 other pieces of resilience legislation and guidance, encompassing:

The lead agency role for offsite emergency planning for Dungeness B, 'Top Tier' Control of Major Accident Hazard (COMAH) industrial sites, Major Accident Hazard Pipelines (MAHP) and larger reservoirs;

Participation within 'Command and Control' structures, including co-operation and co-ordination alongside the emergency services, Government departments and agencies, local authorities, utilities, ports, voluntary sector, and other partners;

Undertaking planning and response activities to safeguard public health and welfare before, during and after emergencies, including supporting affected vulnerable individuals and communities (e.g. sourcing, quality assurance and delivery of PPE, drafting and maintaining the Covid-19 (Coronavirus) Pandemic Contingency and Recovery Plans);

Delivering Business Continuity Planning (BCP) including templates and guidance documents, monitoring of individual service BCP, testing and exercising, maintenance of Corporate BCP and Business Impact Analysis (BIA) and BCP advice to businesses;

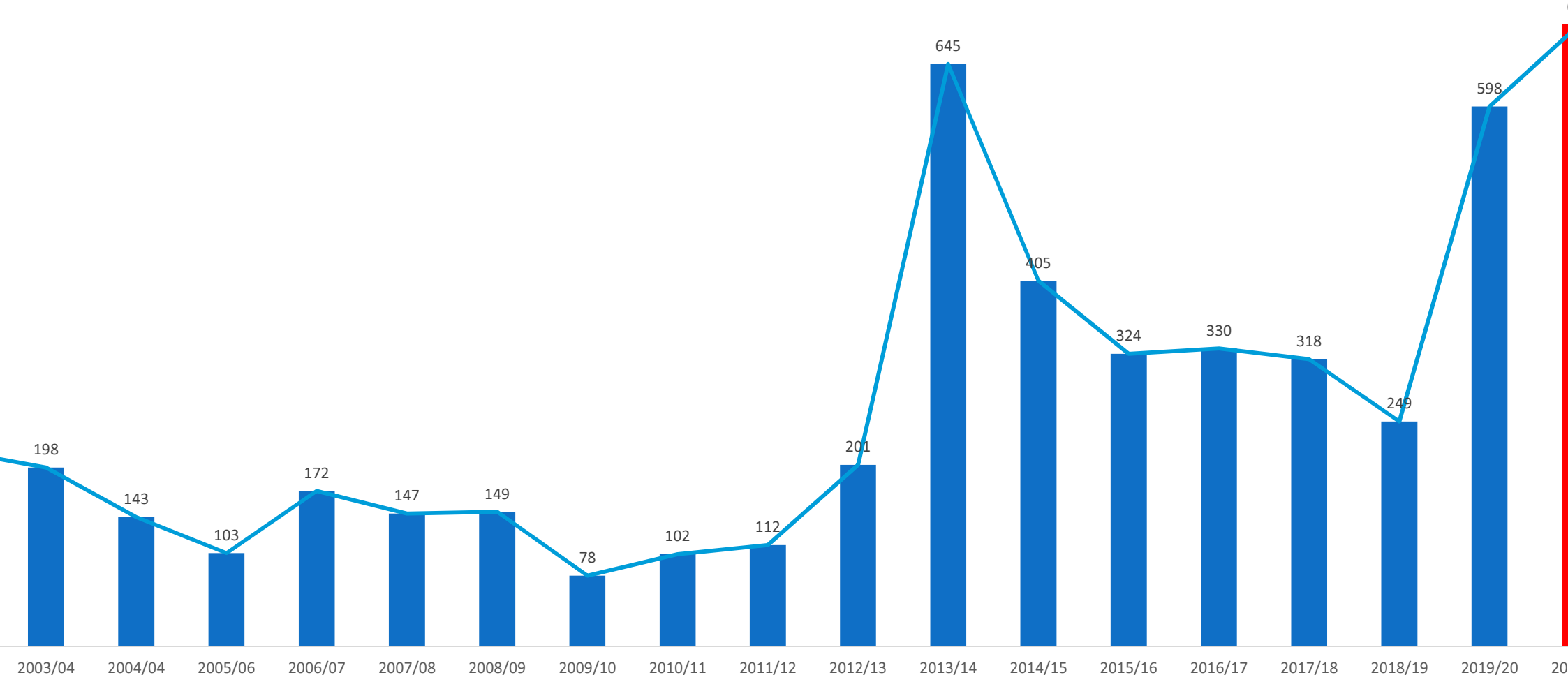


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- Co-ordination of post-incident site demolition, clearance, waste disposal, decontamination, testing and analysis, including 'Tier 2' shoreline pollution response and clean-up;
- Ensuring effective animal and plant health emergency planning and response contingencies for Notifiable and other destructive pests and pathogens (e.g. Foot and Mouth Disease, Avian Influenza, Xylella and Ash Dieback);
- Developing, maintaining and testing by exercise resilience documentation including Major Emergency, Business Continuity, Recovery, Flood Response and other relevant Emergency Plans;
- Ensuring that resilience principles are considered within infrastructure planning and delivery, local and other development plans, and when determining, or consulted upon, major planning applications;
- Providing professional resilience advice and support across Kent County Council (including Elected Members and Committees);
- Maintaining, with KCC colleagues in multiagency KRF Kent Resilience Team, a 24/7 Duty Emergency Planning Officer (DEPO) emergency response capability (in 2020/21 a total of 689 alerts received by DEPO).
