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



















Proportion of population aged 0-5 in Folkestone & Hythe compared to Kent





The children in low income families (CiLIF) statistics provide information on the number and proportion of children living in Relative and Absolute low income before housing costs (BHC) in the reference year. A family must have claimed one or more of Universal Credit, Tax Credits or Housing Benefit at any point in the year to be classed as low income in these statistics.

In 2021/22, 1,300 children aged 0-5 lived in a relative low-income family in Folkestone & Hythe, which is 20.3% of the 0-5 population in the district. The rate for Kent is 16.4%.

There were $\underline{375}$ children aged 0-5 in Folkestone & Hythe with an Early Help (EH) case in 2021/22, which is a rate of $\underline{6.0\%}$ of the 0-5 population in the district. This is <u>higher</u> than the Kent rate of 4.8%.

There were $\underline{335}$ children aged 0-5 in Folkestone & Hythe with a social care care or referral in 2021/22, which is a rate of $\underline{5.4\%}$ of the 0-5 population in the district. This is <u>higher</u> than the Kent rate of 4.9%.












Proportion of health visits or checks completed within target time in 2021/22, compared to the Kent rate (turquoise line).



















Proportion of infants recorded as being breastfed at the New Birth Visit (NBV) and 6-8 week check, compared to the Kent rate (turquoise line).







Healthy Child Clinic rates

There were <u>899</u> Healthy Child Clinics held in <u>Folkestone & Hythe</u> in 2021/22. This means that there were 1 clinic held for every <u>1.1</u> children aged under 1-years-old*.

This is a <u>higher</u> rate compared to Kent overall (1 clinic held for every <u>2.9</u> children aged under 1-years-old).

Breastfeeding Groups rates

There were 109 Breastfeeding Groups held in Folkestone & Hythe in 2021/22. This means that there were 1 group held for every 8.7 children aged under 1-years-old*.

This is a <u>lower</u> rate compared to Kent overall (1 group held for every <u>8.1</u> children aged under 1-years-old).

In the 2021/22 academic year, children centres had visits from <u>864</u> children aged 0-5 who lived in <u>Folkestone & Hythe</u>, which is rate of <u>13.8%</u> of the 0-5 population in the district. This is higher than the Kent rate of 10.1%.

In total, there were 5.814 visits to children centers in 2021/22 from children aged $\overline{0-5}$ who lived in Folkestone & Hythe.






Universal entitlement

All 3 and 4 year olds are entitled to up to 15 hours of free childcare each week for 38 weeks a year, or fewer hours per week over more weeks of a year (up to 570 hours).

In <u>Folkestone & Hythe</u> in the summer term 2022, <u>48.0%</u> of 3 and 4 year olds had taken up Free Early Education (FEE) and <u>40.4%</u> had taken up Extended Funded Entitlement (EFE). Overall takeup was 88.3%.

In comparison, for Kent the take-up rates were $\underline{87.5\%}$ overall, 53.0% for FEE and 34.6% for EFE.

Extended entitlement

Eligible 3 and 4 year olds can receive an extra 15 hours of free childcare each week. Eligibility depends on:

- parent(s) working status
- parent(s) income
- child's age and circumstances
- parent(s) immigration status

Please note that the data does not include children taking up childcare in neighbouring authorities, so take up rates in Dartford and Sevenoaks will be higher than shown in this report.

The childcare sufficiency assessment is based on population forecasts by Edge Analytics and models the required childcare places. This is then compared against the available childcare places.







Of the <u>1,090</u> children assessed in <u>Folkestone & Hythe</u>, <u>66.9%</u> of Year R pupils achieved a Good Level of Development in the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) profile in the 2022 assessment.

This is higher than the Kent rate of 65.4%.
