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



#### % of Tunbridge Wells population aged 0-5 by gender and age










## Tunbridge Wells: CiLIF rank out of the 12 Kent districts

The children in low income families (CiLIF) statistics provide information on the number and proportion of children living in Relative and Absolute low income before housing costs (BHC) in the reference year. A family must have claimed one or more of Universal Credit, Tax Credits or Housing Benefit at any point in the year to be classed as low income in these statistics.

In 2021/22, <u>800</u> children aged 0-5 lived in a relative low-income family in <u>Tunbridge Wells</u>, which is <u>11.3%</u> of the 0-5 population in the district. The rate for Kent is <u>16.4%</u>.




#### % of 0-5 year olds with an Early Help case or social care case/referral by age




Proportion of health visits or checks completed within target time in 2021/22, compared to the Kent rate (turquoise line).

### **Healthy Child Clinic rates**

There were <u>754</u> Healthy Child Clinics held in <u>Tunbridge Wells</u> in 2021/22. This means that there were 1 clinic held for every <u>1.5</u> children aged under 1-years-old\*.

This is a <u>higher</u> rate compared to Kent overall (1 clinic held for every <u>2.9</u> children aged under 1-years-old).

#### **Breastfeeding Groups rates**

There were <u>131</u> Breastfeeding Groups held in <u>Tunbridge Wells</u> in 2021/22. This means that there were 1 group held for every 8.4 children aged under 1-years-old\*.



### **Tunbridge Wells: Visits to Children Centres**



In the 2021/22 academic year, children centres had visits from 948 children aged 0-5 who lived in Tunbridge Wells, which is rate of 12.6% of the 0-5 population in the district. This is higher than the Kent rate of 10.1%.

In total, there were 3,954 visits to children centers in 2021/22 from children aged 0-5 who lived in Tunbridge Wells.




## Tunbridge Wells: Take-up of Free Early Education by 3 & 4 Year Olds






**Universal entitlement** 

All 3 and 4 year olds are entitled to up to 15 hours of free childcare each week for 38 weeks a year, or fewer hours per week over more weeks of a year (up to 570 hours).



In <u>Tunbridge Wells</u> in the summer term 2022, <u>61.1%</u> of 3 and 4 year olds had taken up Free Early Education (FEE) and <u>30.8%</u> had taken up Extended Funded Entitlement (EFE). Overall takeup was 92.0%.

In comparison, for Kent the take-up rates were  $\underline{87.5\%}$  overall, 53.0% for FEE and 34.6% for EFE.



Eligible 3 and 4 year olds can receive an extra 15 hours of free childcare each week. Eligibility depends on:

- parent(s) working status
- parent(s) income
- child's age and circumstances
- parent(s) immigration status

Please note that the data does not include children taking up childcare in neighbouring authorities, so take up rates in Dartford and Sevenoaks will be higher than shown in this report.

0.7% of 0-5 year olds in Tunbridge Wells have an EHCP. The rate for Kent is 1.2%.

The most common need type among 0-5 year olds in Tunbridge Wells is Speech, Language and Communication Needs (45.1%).

The EHCP data includes all children aged 0-5 on 31 August 2021. The rates have been calculated using the 2021 ONS mid-year estimate population figures.

Of the <u>1,138</u> children assessed in <u>Tunbridge Wells</u>, <u>67.6%</u> of Year R pupils achieved a Good Level of Development in the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) profile in the 2022 assessment.

This is <u>higher</u> than the Kent rate of <u>65.4%</u>.
