Forecast Information

Teynham Primary School sits within the Sittingbourne East planning group. The table below shows the forecast need for primary school places in all the primary planning groups in Sittingbourne

Forecasts indicate a slight pressure for Year R places in Sittingbourne East in 2023. It is anticipated that new housing developments in the planning area will increase the pressure on places and it is proposed to expand Sunny Bank Primary School by 0.5FE to meet this need when it arises. There are also a number of housing developments in Teynham and the surrounding area which will place pressure on places available at Teynham primary school, which is already at capacity. The 1FE expansion of Teynham Primary School will be required when the proposed housing in the locality is built out and occupied.

Teynham Primary School Information

Teynham Primary School is a good school as judged by Ofsted in February 2018 and the proposal to rebuild the current primary school and expand the provision by 1FE from 210 pupils to 420. The school will gradually expand taking an additional form of entry in 2025 in reception each year. The proposal is, therefore, in line with the expectation of expanding popular, successful schools and providing local schools for primary aged children wherever possible, having a positive impact on local families. The proposal will provide an additional 30 places in Reception from September 2025 to meet the increasing demand in the area and for families moving into the new housing developments in and surrounding Teynham

The data used in the project is published data on pupil numbers, school performance data and characteristics of the local pupil population.

Teynham Primary School is a voluntary controlled primary school and is currently a one form entry primary school and the proposal is to expand the school to two forms of entry.

An extra Reception class would be added each year starting in September 2025 when the published admission number would increase from 30 to 60.

The school capacity would grow each year, reaching a total capacity of 420 in 2031.

The age range for the school is 5 to 11 years.


