

#### Economy, Health & Food Security:

- Sufficient safe, affordable & nutritious food to meet dietary needs.
- Resilient & Reliable domestic food producing sector is critical.
  - Short, simple domestic supply chains.
  - Control of our own standards.
  - Resilience.
  - Assurance that the UK does not import food leaving other areas in a poorer state. (e.g. from water poor locations).
- Garden of England: Fresh food historically a major part of Kent economy.



### Challenges:

- The UK picture 2023 vs 2021:
  - Fresh Vegetables 53% from 57%.
  - Tomatoes 15% from 18%.
  - Potatoes 62% from 74%.
  - Fresh Fruit 16%.
  - Apples 38%.
  - Pears 8%.
- Pressures include, cost of inputs, wages (50% +), audit & compliance, quality standards & specifications, where food comes from, border checks.
- Supply chains & cost risk, energy & climate.
- Planning Frameworks that omit food production.
- Dietary choice & the retail environment.





#### Opportunities:

Fresh, healthy food underpins the two pillars of Economic growth and Health of the nation.

The food agenda plays a crucial role by emphasising the importance of nutrition and its impact on overall well-being productivity.

British growers are ambitious to produce more of the food our maritime climate enables us to excel at, while reducing our impact on the environment.

- Kent growers & food producers are highly responsive and versatile.
  - KCC leading the way on Public Sector purchasing:
    - Schools, hospitals, staff cafes/canteens.
  - Prioritising "buying Kent grown produce".
    - Trail blazer.
- Future-focussed, investing in high technology & automation.
- Central to the delivery of national food strategy.
  - We are home to 40% of UK horticultural production
  - We are a key gateway to global markets.
- We are supporting skills development.
- Critical to the UK Industrial Strategy.
- Economically active businesses!
  - With turnovers in the millions £.
  - Adding to the GVA of the Kent economy.



# Objectives:

- Place Fresh Food & Horticulture sector at the front and centre of county growth and industrial strategies.
- **Promote fresh food** as the **building block** of healthy living, healthy lives and healthy economic growth.
  - Enabling ambitious targets for growth in the economy and improving lifestyles to be achieved.
- Boost productivity, supporting innovation and strengthening supply chains – including through local public sector purchasing.
  - Delivers the Governments ambition of half of all food purchased via public sector to be locally produced.
- Support a pipeline of people into the industry, tackling barriers to employment.
- Demand for fresh food is growing, and Kent is perfectly placed to produce it.
