Although the number of responses received was very low, there was unanimous support for the proposal.

Parents thought that the proposal was a good idea and that the opportunity for Umbrella Nursery to take over the maintained nursery unit accommodation would benefit the preschool children in the community.

Dr Eddy, Leader of the Labour Group agrees with the general proposal to change the age range but objects to the removal of a maintained nursery and would seek detailed monitoring of future nursery provision for the community.

The Children's Centre teacher responded that although she saw it as a great shame to close the maintained nursery unit she believed that Umbrella Nursery would provide good quality provision which would be of great benefit to the local community.
