Academy

Background

1. (1) In December 2008, Carillion plc was appointed to deliver the five Academies within the first batch of Kent Academies to be delivered through the Partnerships for Schools (PfS) National Framework.

- (2) Under the Batched Contract, Carillion could be appointed to deliver each of the five Academies without having to run a competition each time. Each Academy is let under an independent Design and Build contract. Delegated Approval was granted (Decision No: 08-01195) to the Director of Resources, Families and Education and the Director of Law and Governance to negotiate all necessary contracts and enter into contracts as required in respect of the following schools:
 - New Line Learning (formerly Oldborough Manor and Senacre)
 - Cornwallis
 - Longfield (formerly Axtane Chase)
 - Marsh (formerly Southlands)
 - Spires (formerly The Montgomery)

- 3. (1) Kent County Council (KCC) submitted an Expression of Interest (EoI) to transform Montgomery School into an Academy in 2006. The EoI was approved by the DCSF in March 2006. The Funding Agreement between the Department for Children, Schools and Families (DCSF) and the Academy Trust was signed in May 2007. Montgomery School closed in July 2007 and the new Spires Academy opened in September 2007.
- (2) The proposed scope of the project is to pursue a 100% new build construction solution for Spires Academy. This will involve disposing of the site of the predecessor school, Montgomery School, re-investing the capital receipt of that site into the overall capital envelope for the project, and building an entirely new facility for Spires Academy on an adjacent sports field.
- (3) Detailed planning consent for the new design was obtained in February 2011 and Carillion are working towards satisfying the pre-commencement planning conditions.
- (4) Carillion are in the process of submitting the final Contractors Proposals which form part of the Design and Build contract (the Design and Build contract is entered into by the Authority and Carillion). These have been reviewed and challenged where appropriate by Gleeds, who are appointed as the Authority's technical advisors, and have been approved by the Authority.
- (5) The terms of the Development Agreement, which is entered into by the Authority and the Academy Trust, and include a long lease of the Academy site to the Academy Trust, is nearing final completion. The details of the long lease have been discussed and are being approved under by the Property Group as part of the property protocol.
- (6) Legal Advice on both the Design and Build contract and the Development Agreement has been provided by Nabarros.
- (7) The Final Business Case will be submitted to Partnerships for Schools during February 2011 and is currently undergoing their review process. Formal approval from PfS is expected in time for the planned contract signature which is targeted for the 11th March 2011.
- (8) Subject to final approval from PfS, Grahame Ward and Geoff Wild, under their delegated powers are authorised to proceed to the signing of the contracts.
 - (9) The Academy is responsible for procuring their own ICT solution.

Resource Implications

4. Spires Academy is 100% new build funded mainly by grant from PfS. The total contribution required by KCC towards the construction of Spires Academy is £1.5m. This is to be funded from the net proceeds from the sale of the site of the current Academy buildings.

Recommendation

- 6. The Cabinet Member for Education, Learning and Skills is asked to agree in accordance with Decision No 08-01195 (a): TO
 - (i) submit the Final Business Case and subject to its approval by the Department for Education and Partnership For Schools proceed to financial close and with the Contractor to deliver the Spires Academy
 - (ii) AUTHORISE the Director, Children, Families & Education, Capital Programme and Infrastructure, The Head of Private Finance Initiative /Public Private Partnership in consultation with the Director of Law and Governance to enter into any necessary contracts/ agreements on behalf of the County Council
 - (iii) AUTHORISE the Head of Private Finance Initiative /Public Private Partnership to be the nominated Authority Representative within the relevant agreements and to enter into variations as envisaged under the contracts.
