## PROPOSED EXPANSION OF CHALLOCK PRIMARY SCHOOL

## Summary of the Public Meeting held on 11 July 2011 at Challock PS

Approximately 70 people attended the public meeting including parents, governors and other interested parties.

Headteacher: The school fully supports this	• • • • •
proposal. With our current mixed age	
groups some parents find it an issue if their	
child "stays down". Before this proposal	
budgets were slashed and we were facing a	
redundancy situation. This proposal has	
helped. Larger schools are stronger, smaller	
schools are quite vulnerable.	
We take the parking issue very seriously.	
We are fortunate to be able to use the village	
hall car park and we often send reminder	
letters to parents. In the last 5 years we	
have developed two walking buses – one	
from across The Lees and one from the car	
park and as parents come into reception we	
encourage them to use the car park.	
Chair of Governors: The Governing Body	
endorses this proposal. The school has an	
excellent reputation. Our last Ofsted was	
good with outstanding features and we are	
striving to make it outstanding all round.	
The proposal is to enlarge the school a little.	
It's not a massive enlargement. Birth rate is	
increasing. The current size means we are	
subjected to mixed year groups so	
constantly struggle with resources, always	
looking at staffing. We feel that what is	
gained by the children and the community	
outweighs any temporary disruption caused	
by setting that process up. I know that	
parking is an issue; it's a perennial problem	
wherever you go.	
We try to address the problems – parking on	
zigzags, bad language etc and we will	
continue to do so.

I consider that increasing the school by 50% is a major increase. It will reduce the play area. Twice as many children in half the amount of space.	When the school was built it was built to accommodate a 1fe primary school. Playing field regulations say we will have enough space for 210 children. The mobile will be placed where the "mound" currently is. We will be making use of dead space.
The school is not an overspill for Ashford and that's what it's becoming.	We cannot control where parents send their children. They have the right to express a preference. Some parents come from Charing which is odd as that is further away than Kennington.
What percentage of children have come from the village and surrounding villages? And what percentage has come from Kennington in the past? If the school is increased in size what percentage will come from Kennington? Schools should be built at Goat Lees, Trinity Road etc. We should not be attracting those people to come here and cause problems.	
I've been here since the 1960s. It's always been a good school.  The school has always had good results. It is not at risk in my opinion.	Any school below 210 pupils are the first schools at risk if numbers drop. A few less pupils in a smaller than 1fe school can lead to redundancies.  We will secure the future of the school for years to come by making it 1fe. The increase is slightly under 50%. In the time it will take the school to grow to 1fe the LA will put pressure on the school and the Governing Body re the parking issue.
There are schools planned at Repton Park and Goat Lees, which is 6 miles away. Do the figures include these schools?	The schools at Repton Park and Goat Lees are to meet the significant demand from new development in those areas. We want to ensure that children can go to their nearest local school.
Where will the children be eating? Currently they use classrooms and the hall. Will the hall be made bigger? When the school has functions the hall is barely adequate for children and parents now – what will happen in the future? The Harvest Festival was held at the local church and there was standing room only. Will you need to submit more plans for more space?	The school will trial different methods at lunchtime and use the village hall for performances etc. We could, for example, do a harvest festival for infants and one for juniors.
I know you will build on the "mound" but there will be more children in the space. My son has special needs. The school was worried about him being knocked over. The SENCo is part-time at the moment, will her hours be increased?	The school will consider the need for additional hours for the SENCo as children come into the school.
When there are 30 pupils in a class will there be more support? More TAs? What will be the ratio of teacher or support staff to pupils?	Classes are 30 now, so there will be no change. As the school grows the school will look at additional support. The school will consider the needs of all children, not just SEN children.

Issue or Comment	Response
My child is in Y2 and currently split with a Y1 class. In the juniors there are classes of 20. Will those classes stay at 20 while my child is there or can you add 10 additional children?	The expansion will be a rolling through process (unless there is a casual admission). Plan is that current classes will roll through the school and the PAN of 30 will roll up through the school. Additional staff will be provided as needed.
I am in support of the proposal but why is the decision about the expansion not made until December when the mobile will be in place from October?	There were 28 applications for reception this year and the LA asked the school to take 30. The LA agreed to provide additional accommodation. The mobile will be temporary until the formal consultation ends and formal decision is made. If the public consultation stops at any stage in the process then the accommodation will be needed for the 30 children arriving in 2011. It would be removed after seven years.
By KCC spending probably £250k on a mobile classroom will that in any way influence the decision on this proposal?	No. The need to expand is for the 28 applicants who wanted places in the school. We have to respond to that. Future government legislation is likely to say expansion of the school will come first. The cost of the mobile classroom is around £120k. It's a significant sum but we have to do it because local parents want their children to come here.
I am a parent and a midwife and I can assure you that there will be no difficulty in filling the extra spaces needed at this school. I fully support the proposal. The parking is going to be a big issue, but that's the only issue and I support the proposal.	
If the mobile does not arrive until October what happens in September and up until the mobile arrives?  I think this is an excellent idea for the	The school will move things around. The SENCo room will be used to accommodate 20 children temporarily.
