Summary:

Following the recommendations from Education Cabinet Committee on 14 March 2014, the Cabinet Member for Education and Health Reform is requested to agree to the recommendations below to:

Recommendations:

- (i) To agree the increase in the designated pupil number of pupil places from 164 to 180 for September 2014.
- (ii) Allocate £3.5m from the Targeted Basic Need Budget and £11.1m from the Special School Review Capital Budget in order that the school may be relocated and expanded.
- (iii) Authorise the Director of Property and Infrastructure Support in consultation with the Director of Governance and Law to enter into any necessary contracts/agreements on behalf of the County Council
- (iv) Authorise the Director of Property and Infrastructure Support to be the nominated Authority Representative within the relevant agreements and to enter into variations as envisaged under the contracts

1. Introduction

- 1.1 As the strategic commissioner of school provision, the Local Authority has a duty to ensure that there are sufficient school places for the residents of Kent. This duty applies to Special school provision, as well as mainstream settings.
- 1.2 Kent County Council's strategy for children and young people with special educational needs and who are disabled (SEND) identified the need to add 275 additional SEN places in Kent for pupils with Autism and Behavioural Needs. 175 of these places will be in special schools. Furthermore, the 'Kent

Commissioning Plan for Education Provision' referred to additional demand for 2014-2016 to be met by commissioning additional places across Kent.

- 1.3 The Government has recognised the demand in Tonbridge and Malling and has allocated Targeted Basic Need funding totalling £3.5 million for the purposes of expanding and relocating Ridge View School in order to increase the places offered by September 2015.
- 1.5 Ridge View is a successful school, graded 'good' by Ofsted. The school provides for pupils with profound, multiple, and severe learning difficulties and autistic spectrum disorders. Over half have autistic spectrum disorders as a primary need. In addition, many have a range of complex needs including sensory impairment, hearing impairment, physical impairment and delayed cognitive development. The majority of the children in the Oakridge Assessment nursery have a statement of special educational needs and a high proportion use alternative or augmentative methods of communication. Apart from attending Ridge View, nursery children enter a variety of other special schools, specialist mainstream schools and mainstream provisions. Ridae View currently incorporates specialist pre-school and nursery provision from two years (Oakridge) as well as students aged four to nineteen. All are designated as having Profound, Severe & Complex needs.
- 1.6 The numbers of children surviving with profound, severe and complex (PSC) learning difficulties is increasing which has resulted in pressure on places in Kent. This, combined with the need to offer places that avoid long travelling distances for vulnerable young children means that KCC requires Ridge View School to increase the number of places it offers from its current position 107 pupils on roll and the school at maximum capacity to a capacity of 180. KCC's 10 PSC schools have seen their rolls rise from 1666 pupils in 2009 to 2004 in 2013, a 17% rise. In particular the growth has been in the early years phase, where we have seen Reception Year rolls increase by 36%, from 84 to 114 across the schools.
- 1.7 Ridge View School is located in unsuitable buildings in North Tonbridge and does not have sufficient outdoor play and sports facilities. The school shares a campus with two mainstream schools, preventing expansion to provide the additional capacity that is desperately needed.

2. Proposals

2.1 The relocation and expansion of Ridge View School does not necessitate statutory consultation under the School Organisation (Prescribed Alterations to Maintained Schools) (England) Regulations 2013 as the proposed increase in designated number is less than 10% of the current designated number and the proposed relocation is under two miles from the current site. Therefore, the Cabinet Member for Education and Health Reform is asked to agree the increase in the designated number at Ridge View School from 164 to 180 for September 2014 and to allocate £3.5 million from the Targeted Basic Need budget and £11.1 million from the Special School Review Capital Programme budget to complete the necessary works.

3. Resource Implications

- a) Capital Proposals relating to regularising designated numbers do not have any capital implications. The capital costs of relocating and rebuilding Ridge View School is being allocated from the Targeted Basic Need budget and the Special School Review Capital Programme budget.
- b) Revenue The schools delegated budget will be allocated on an agreed number of commissioned places in accordance with the High Needs funding methodology of 'Place Plus'.
- c) Human Ridge View School will appoint additional teachers, as the school size increases and the need arises.

4. Equality Impact Assessments

4.1 An Equality Impact Assessment was completed as part of the SEN review, which highlighted the need for expansion of this school.

5. Local Member Opinion

5.1 There are two Local Members for Tonbridge, one of whom, Mr Chris Smith, is on the planning committee and is unable to comment in advance. The other, Mr Richard Long, supports the relocation of Ridge View School for the benefit of the pupils who will be admitted, but will wish to discuss the traffic implications, access, use of green field land and suitability of the preferred site generally during the planning process.

6. Area Education Officer Opinion

6.1 The Area Education Officer for West Kent fully supports this proposal and believes that it is critical that the enlargement and relocation of Ridge View School takes place to provide improved facilities for existing pupils and ensure that the demand for special school places can be met in the locality.

7. Education Cabinet Committee Opinion

7.1 At its meeting on 14 March 2014 the Committee recommended to the Cabinet Member for Education and Health Reform that the public consultations on the proposals set out in the report be undertaken.

8. <u>Recommendations</u>

The Cabinet Member for Education and Health Reform is requested to agree to the recommendations below to:

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- (ii) Allocate £3.5m from the Targeted Basic Need Budget and £11.1m from the Special School Review Capital Budget in order that the school may be relocated and expanded.
- (iii) Authorise the Director of Property and Infrastructure Support in consultation with the Director of Governance and Law to enter into any necessary contracts/ agreements on behalf of the County Council.

(iv)	Authorise the Director of Property and Infrastructure Support to be

	agreements and to enter into variations as envisaged under the contracts.
