Summary: Notification of a call-in of decision number 15/00114 was received from Mr

Cowan on 24 February 2016 which was supported by Mr Latchford. This report sets out the reasons behind the call-in and the options for the

Scrutiny Committee.

1. Background

1.1 On 23 February 2016 the Cabinet Member for Education and Health Reform took a decision to issue a public notice to close Pent Valley Technology College from September 2016 for current years 7, 8, 9 and 11 from 31 August 2016 and for all years from August 2017.

2. Reasons justifying the call-in – from Mr G Cowan and Mr R Latchford

- 2.1 Full details and breakdown of how much this closure is going to cost.
- 2.2 If proposal to close the school goes ahead what does KCC intend doing with the school, and how much will it cost to mothball it?
- 2.3 If and when it reopens, how much will it cost KCC to transfer to an Academy/Free school?
- 2.4 How have KCC allowed this school to fall into such a financial shortfall, when was it first recognised there was such a financial problem, and what have KCC done to try and alleviate the problem much sooner?
- 2.5 When did the pupil numbers start to fall? Was it at the point of KCC announcing the possible closure? It is so often the case when parents hear such announcements that they look elsewhere to send their children to other school because of the fear of the possible closure announcement.
- 2.6 What was the full response to the Public Consultation? This should be highly relevant to any decision made by the Cabinet.
