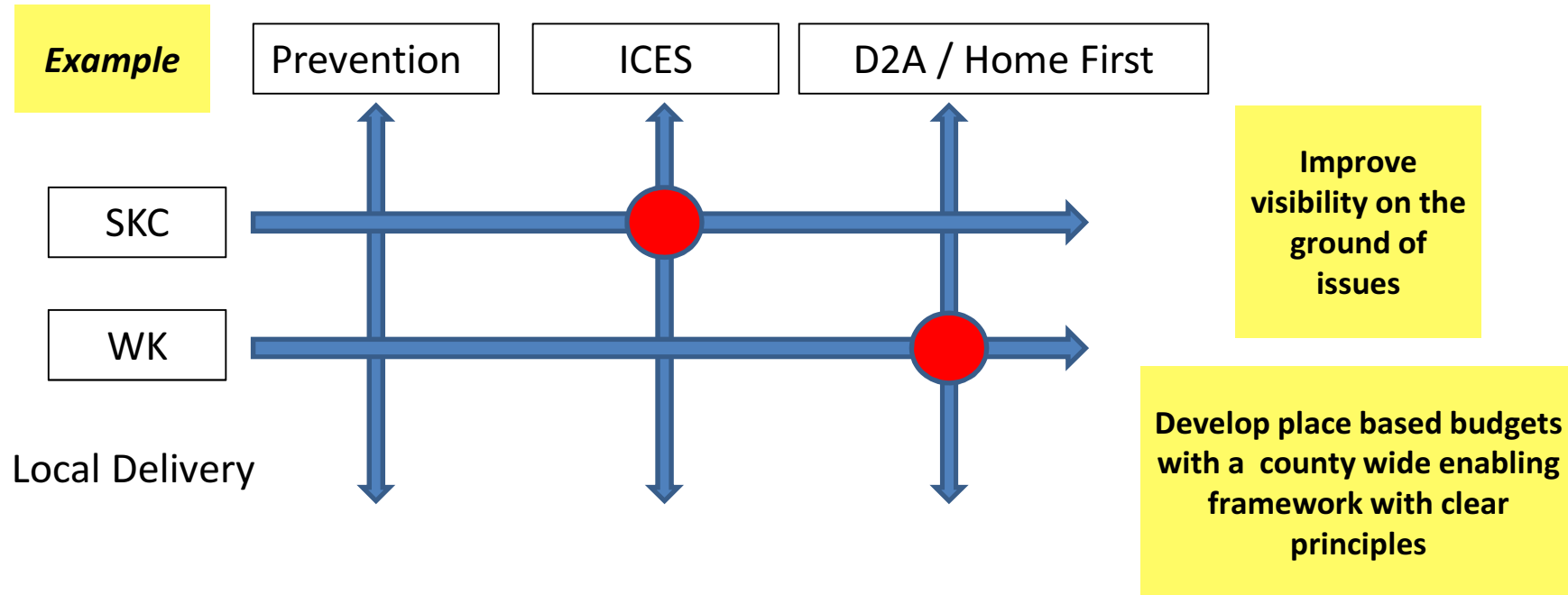


Ensuring Local Delivery
