<p>Key points of the appellants case</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Isabella has been very unwell and has not yet recovered from the operations that she received in January and as transport is not been awarded it is preventing her education.</li> <li>• Diagnosed with thyroid cancer and had two major operations to remove a lump from her neck and thyroids.</li> <li>• She had radiotherapy in January which killed the rest of the cancer cells.</li> <li>• She is unable to walk far, she has no energy and not able to participate in sports and day to day activities</li> <li>• She has had a lot of time off of work due to being so ill.</li> <li>• She is now on a lifetime of medication once a day.</li> <li>• Also on disability moving allowance</li> <li>• Additional information from NHS</li> <li>•</li> <li>•</li> </ul>	<p><b>The Panel were still in agreement that they would not support this. They considered the high cost of the transport that would need to be put in place and still came to the conclusion that although they had further correspondence with the parent it did not change the original decision from the last Panel.</b></p>
