Summary and recommendations of equality analysis/impact assessment.

Context

KCC has been working closely with the Department for Transport (DfT), Kent Police and Highways England, amongst others, to establish plans to manage freight in Kent in anticipation of the end of Transition on the 31st December 20

As part of this work, Government has identified the need for sites to provide additional custom checking and freight holding areas. The first site is adjacent to J10a, M20 and will provide capacity to hold up to 2,000 HGVs.

Aims and Objectives

The project is to support a Government programme to ensure the UK is prepared to leave the EU on 31st December. The scope of the project addresses the anticipated impact upon our local road network and wider Kent communities.

Summary of equality impact

This EqIA is for the construction of a site adjacent to J10a, M20 tor provide a custom checking service and capacity to hold up to 2,000 HGVs. KCC's role is to prepare and construct the site. Initially, works will include:

- construction of an enclosed site to allow for border readiness checks to be undertaken and for the temporary holding of HGVs from 1st January 2021
- preparing the site in readiness for construction
- undertaking work to protect or relocate existing utilities
- creating a site entrance and junction on A2070 link road and associated highway works
- creating attenuation ponds and network connections for drainage from the site

The future provision of custom checking service and site management is outside the scope of this project. KCC's involvement is for the construction works only.
