



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
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% of Sevenoaks population aged 0-5 compared to Kent







Population aged 0-5 in Sevenoaks







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The children in low income families (CiLIF) statistics provide information on the number and proportion of children living in Relative and Absolute low income before housing costs (BHC) in the reference year. A family must have claimed one or more of Universal Credit, Tax Credits or Housing Benefit at any point in the year to be classed as low income in these statistics.

In 2021/22, 900 children aged 0-5 lived in a relative low-income family in Sevenoaks, which is 10.7% of the 0-5 population in the district. The rate for Kent is 16.4%.

There were 218 children aged 0-5 in Sevenoaks with an Early Help (EH) case in 2021/22, which is a rate of 2.7% of the 0-5 population in the district. This is lower than the Kent rate of 4.8%.







There were 258 children aged 0-5 in Sevenoaks with a social care care or referral in 2021/22, which is a rate of 3.2% of the 0-5 population in the district. This is lower than the Kent rate of 4.9%.

% of 0-5 year olds with an Early Help case or social care case/referral by age





The figures for Early Help and social care cases are a distinct count of 0-5 year olds involved in a request for support that resulted in support during the 2021-22 academic year. The age is calculated as of 31/08/2022 and unborn are included in the figures for 0 year olds. The rates have been calculated using the 2021 ONS mid-year estimate population figures.

Healthy Child Clinic rates

There were 114 Healthy Child Clinics held in Sevenoaks in 2021/22. This means that there were 1 clinic held for every 11.1 children aged under 1-years-old*.

This is a lower rate compared to Kent overall (1 clinic held for every 2.9 children aged under 1-years-old).

Breastfeeding Groups rates

There were 67 Breastfeeding Groups held in Sevenoaks in 2021/22. This means that there were 1 group held for every 18.9 children aged under 1-years-old*.

This is a lower rate compared to Kent overall (1 group held for every 8.1 children aged under 1-years-old).

In the 2021/22 academic year, children centres had visits from 749 children aged 0-5 who lived in Sevenoaks, which is rate of 9.1% of the 0-5 population in the district. This is lower than the Kent rate of 10.1%.

In total, there were 3,742 visits to children centers in 2021/22 from children aged 0-5 who lived in Sevenoaks.



Overall take-up of free early education by 3 & 4 year olds



Universal entitlement


All 3 and 4 year olds are entitled to up to 15 hours of free childcare each week for 38 weeks a year, or fewer hours per week over more weeks of a year (up to 570 hours).



In Sevenoaks in the summer term 2022, 57.3% of 3 and 4 year olds had taken up Free Early Education (FEE) and 22.4% had taken up Extended Funded Entitlement (EFE). Overall take-up was 79.8%.

In comparison, for Kent the take-up rates were 87.5% overall, 53.0% for FEE and 34.6% for EFE.

Extended entitlement

Eligible 3 and 4 year olds can receive an extra 15 hours of free childcare each week. Eligibility depends on:

- parent(s) working status
- parent(s) income
- child's age and circumstances
- parent(s) immigration status

Please note that the data does not include children taking up childcare in neighbouring authorities, so take up rates in Dartford and Sevenoaks will be higher than shown in this report.

The childcare sufficiency assessment is based on population forecasts by Edge Analytics and models the required childcare places. This is then compared against the available childcare places.

0.8% of 0-5 year olds in Sevenoaks have an EHCP. The rate for Kent is 1.2%.

The most common need type among 0-5 year olds in Sevenoaks is Speech, Language and Communication Needs (40.0%).

The EHCP data includes all children aged 0-5 on 31 August 2021. The rates have been calculated using the 2021 ONS mid-year estimate population figures.

Of the 1,254 children assessed in Sevenoaks, 70.0% of Year R pupils achieved a Good Level of Development in the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) profile in the 2022 assessment.

This is higher than the Kent rate of 65.4%.
