

# **Shepway Local Board LSG Summaries**

## **Summary of projects and funding needed:**

### **1. 1<sup>st</sup> New Romney Scout Group - £500**

**Funding needed for the 22<sup>nd</sup> World Scout Jamboree in Sweden: to enhance understanding of other cultures and help communication with people from around the world. After the Jamboree presentations will be made which will help to pass on the experience and help raise the profile of scouting.**

### **2. St Johns Primetime Pensioners Group - £1,000**

**Funding needed for the 'Primetime out and about project' To enable the group to offer opportunities for affordable/subsidised social events including excursions and visiting speakers attending the weekly group to encourage learning experiences (health, legal and leisure etc).**

### **3. EPM - £1,000**

**Funding needed for the 'Shepway Career/Skill Fair', To contribute towards the costs of providing coaches for all students attending the event and to help with the running and organising of the project.**

### **4. New Romney Counselling Services - £3,000**

**Funding needed for the 'New Romney counselling services for couple counselling and group therapy to cover the cost of the rent of new premises for a one year pilot of a new service of couple counselling and group therapy in areas such as eating disorders, domestic violence, rape and assertiveness.**

### **5. KCC, Countryside Access Service - £1,000**

**Funding needed for the 'Royal Military Canal Cycle Route Extension' To contribute towards the surfacing of a 1 mile extension of the surfaced multiuser route along Royal Military Canal connecting Hythe to Port Lyme Zoo.**

### **6. St Augustines Catholic Primary School - £1,000**

**Funding needed for an outdoor activities project – to help improve the outdoor facilities at the school which will be available for use by the local community**

**7. Kent's Elham Valley Visitor Group - £1,000**

Funding needed for 'Kents Elham Valley' project to address the issue of information provision and promotion of Elham Valley as a destination. Funding will be used towards an outwards facing promotional leaflet and a comprehensive map based publication.

**8. Lyminge Village Hall - £1000**

Funding needed to install a hot water unit which will feed the disabled and gents toilets. Currently neither toilet has hot water, the village hall is used by groups of all ages within the community.

**9. Songs and Noise - £3,000**

Funding will contribute towards setting up a community choir for all primary school pupils across Shepway – this funding will be specifically used to target the six primaries in Folkestone West. Funding is required for advertising, performance venues and to cover the cost of the 2 choir leaders.

**10. Brockhill Performing Arts College- £250**

Funding will contribute towards the sixth form prom which will be organised by pupils at the school for all 6<sup>th</sup> form pupils to attend.

**11. Folkestone and District Mind - £1,030**

Funding required to cover the cost of redecorating the shop to make it welcoming for customers and volunteers and to provide a room divider to enable confidential services to be held without interfering with office and administration work.

**12. Hawkinge Cricket Club - £3,150**

Funding will contribute towards a much needed practice facility for the young cricketers at Hawkinge. This will comprise of an artificial pitch enclosed with a steel net cage.

**13. Folkestone Film Factory CIC - £2,000**

To contribute towards the planning of workshops, insurances, training and booking films and resources for the 2011 Freedayz Film Festival. The Freedayz film festival will include a number of outdoor family film screening and events including workshops which will benefit the whole family for free.

#### **14. Reading by Colour - £596**

To increase the provision of free screening at the point of need for Irlen syndrome (Irlen Syndrome is a condition that affects the quality of life for 12-15% of the population but is easily controlled through assessment and coloured filters that help children and adults regain control of their lives). Specifically funding is required for 2 extra screeners, crb checks, manuals and training and to provide coloured overlays to be donated to families in need.

#### **15. Skillnet Group CIC - £2,000**

The funding will contribute to the Raising Awareness in Schools and Making English Real project. The Raising Awareness project will involve taking a presentation into schools/colleges which has been developed by people with learning disabilities to help break down barriers which may exist between teenagers and people with learning disabilities. The making English real project will focus on helping children to write business letters/applications and will provide mock interviews. Funding will be used to cover salaries, rent, stationary and running costs.

#### **16. Decuria Youth Club - £1301**

To provide a 12 week cooking course for attendees of the youth club combining cooking and a social event for all the family at the end of the course. Funding would be used to cover the cost of hiring a venue, purchase ingredients, display boards and the end of the course social event.

#### **17. Working Wardrobe CIC - £1,970**

To set up a "What About You" course for a group of twelve to fifteen of their clients, living in Cheriton in Folkestone. Each course runs over 6 sessions and includes subsequent mentoring support for each participant. It is aimed at building confidence, helping with goal setting, building a support network and giving practical soft skills to women who may have become isolated as a result of a career break (to raise children), caring for a dependent, as a victim of domestic violence or simply wanting to build their independence.

#### **18. Hawkinge Community Centre – £1000**

To provide a digital LCD screen in the foyer area of the Community Centre to better promote all the activities and facilities on offer. Activities include sporting, cultural, musical and intellectual events such as short mat bowls, Nepalese dancing and events targeted at Hawkinge's Ghurka population, children's clubs and sports, ballroom dancing, concerts, and committee meetings for Hawkinge's 100+ voluntary organisations.

**19. Lyminge Youth Action - £2,000**

The MUGA (Multi Use Games Area) was installed in 2007. The use of the court has proved very popular for 5-a-side football in the winter and tennis during the summer. However, the court is directly adjacent to the Lyminge Bowls Club premises and unfortunately there has been several instances of sports balls accidentally landing on their green and sometimes hitting bowls club members. Therefore LYA is installing a net extension of 1m along the adjacent side to minimise instances of these occurrences.

**20. 105.9 Academy FM - £3000**

To contribute towards the launch and running of 105.9 Academy FM. The radio station has been awarded a community radio licence and will be officially launched in March 2011. 105.9 Academy FM will broadcast from Folkestone for Folkestone giving the community a voice that is heard, raising awareness and self esteem.

**21. Greatstone Website - £600**

To contribute towards refurbishing the notice-board to improve the look of the beach entrance and to inform visitors where they can eat obtain accommodation etc and to provide local information for residents of Greatstone.

**22. Southern Way Community Association - £4120**

To contribute towards a community climbing facility at Southern Way Folkestone. The park currently contains swings and three other pieces of equipment, it is extremely popular facility and the children and young people who use it have requested a climbing frame to add to the variety of activities on offer. Children from St Marys school help maintain and the park.

**23. Lydd Club Day Committee - £600**

To contribute towards the 2011 club day in Lydd. This free event has been running annually for 141years and benefits the community of Lydd and the surrounding areas of the Romney Marsh. Funding will be used towards, expenses incurred to provide free attractions for families such as donkey rides, face painting and also to cover the cost of insurance.

**24. Folkestone town Centre Management - £2,000**

Funding will be used to contribute towards the Folkestone 2011 St Georges Day celebrations. Funding will be used towards entertainment, the purchase of a maypole and dance tuition day for

teachers and youth leaders. The entertainment and tuition will all be free so all residents of Shepway will be able to benefit from the day.

**25. Palmarsh Village Hall - £1,000**

Funding needed for the 'Palmarsh village Hall Building Repairs project' To replace the exterior wooden fascia's, guttering and drain pipes with UPVC boards and drainage fittings.

**26. Hythe Lawn Tennis Club - £1,500**

Funding needed for an additional external toilet to the south of the pavilion for the benefit of those who use the club and also by those who do not have a key to the pavilion.

**27. Hythe Civic Society - £1,150**

Funding will be used to paint the remaining street furniture (including lamp posts, no entry signs and dead end signs) to improve the look of Historic Hythe for the enjoyment of all.

**28. Kent County Council - £1,150**

Funding will be used redesign the Brockhill site leaflet. The project will combine the brockhill country park leaflet with the wildlife trail leaflet, for the benefit of visitors especially those new to the area.

**29. Shepway District council - £750**

Funding will be used to purchase a football kit for the East Folkestone young people working with Charlton FC, to represent East Folkestone in matches across the district and further afield.

**30. Folkestone Air Cadets - £767**

To buy new instruments, equipment and spares for the band. The new instruments will provide more positions for the young people of Folkestone and Hythe to join the band and learn a new skill. The spares will ensure the groups can continue to perform in competitions and public and private events for many years to come.

**31. Zippers Bowling Association - £500**

To contribute towards equipment and team shirts needed for the bowling club, to help raise their profile within their community.

**32. Folkestone Town Council - £2000**

**Funding needed to improve the appearance of the town square and add to the attraction of Folkestone for residents and visitors. Funding will contribute towards planting new trees in the town.**

**33. Hythe Civic Society - £1,600**

**Funding will be used to purchase a new bench to improve the look of Historic Hythe for the enjoyment of all.**

**34. NAS - £283**

**Funding required to contribute towards the set up and running of the fun club for children with autism and their families**

**35. ACRK - £1133**

**Funding required to contribute towards the running costs of providing a funding fair for community and voluntary groups at Folkestone academy, 100 places will be allocated for Shepway based groups.**

**36. New Romney Town Council - £2,000**

**Funding will contribute towards the New Romney in Bloom, Planters will be purchased for both ends of the central trading centre of the town to make the town more appealing to visitors and residents.**

**37. New Romney CCTV trust - £1,000**

**Funding will contribute towards the purchase, installation and maintenance of CCTV camera and supporting recording equipment to cover New Romney high street, St martins Field and St Nicholas Church/Old school, New Romney.**
