FORWARD PLAN OF DECISIONS

Each month the Council publishes a Forward Plan of Decisions expected to be taken during the following six months.

A "Key Decision" is an Executive-side Decision which is likely to:

- (a) result in the council incurring expenditure which is, or the making of savings which are, significant having regard to the council's budget for the service or function to which the decision relates; or
- (b) be significant in terms of its effects on communities living or working in an area comprising two or more electoral divisions in the area of the local authority.

Key Decisions can only be taken by the Cabinet, the Leader or an individual Cabinet Member.

Decisions which should be regarded as Key Decisions because they are likely to have a significant effect either in financial terms or on the Council's services to the community include:

- (a) Decisions about expenditure or savings over £1,000,000 which are not provided for within the approved budget or Medium Term Financial Plan
- (b) Adoption of major new policies not already included in the Policy Framework (Constitution Appendix 3) or changes to established policies
- (c) Approval of management and business plans
- (d) Decisions that involve significant service developments, significant service reductions, or significant changes in the way that services are delivered, whether County-wide or in a particular locality. For example, closure of a school, approval of a major project (such as a highway scheme) or programme of works, major changes in the eligibility criteria for provision of a service, major changes in the fees charged for a service, or proposals that would result in a service currently provided in-house being outsourced.
- (e) Decisions where the consequences are likely to result in compulsory redundancies or major changes in the terms and conditions of employment of a significant number of employees in any of the Council's functions.

Preparation of the Forward Plan helps the Council to programme its work and ensures compliance with the Local Government Act 2000. Every month, the period covered by the Plan will be rolled forward by one month and the plan will be republished.

The Plan outlines the consultation that is proposed in respect of future decisions and who members of the public and the Council should contact to make comments on any particular item. Anyone is entitled to obtain copies of the documents that will be relied upon when a decision is taken, unless those documents are 'Exempt' within the meaning of the relevant sections of the Local Government Act 1972 (as amended).

Reports related to decisions will be published on the Council's web site at www.kent.gov.uk at least five days before the decision it is due to be taken. Once the decision has been taken, a copy of the Record of Decision will also be published on the Council's website.

Title:

Excellent Homes for All - 12/01904

The Decision needed:

On 15 September 2008 Cabinet approved a report recommending the submission of an Outline Business Case for the Excellent Homes For All housing PFI project and the progression of its procurement.

This report updates Cabinet on the project which is being procured in partnership with five District Council authorities and will result in the provision of at least 220 new homes for vulnerable people in Kent.

This report requests Cabinet to approve:

- Delegated Authority to the Corporate Director for Families and Social Care (or other nominated officer), in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Adult Social Care and Public Health, to sign the contract documentation including the Project Agreement which will enable the project to become operational;
- Delegated Authority to the Corporate Director for Families and Social Care (or other nominated officer), in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Adult Social Care and Public Health, to sign the Back to Back Agreement to share the risks and benefits of the project with our District Council partners;
- The use of the designated sites for the project
- Approval for the required Authority contribution for the duration of the contract.

How the decision relates to BS4K and Corporate Objectives

The project is in line with KCC strategies and in particular supports the following:

Bold Steps for Kent Priorities:

- 2 Support the transformation of health and social care in Kent
- 8 Respond to key regeneration challenges working with our partners
- 9 Support new housing growth that is affordable, sustainable and with the appropriate infrastructure
- 15 Improve services for the most vulnerable people in Kent

'Better Homes: Localism, Aspiration and Choice'. Kent's Housing Strategy states as an ambition: "to support vulnerable people in housing need to fulfil

their potential and live a high quality life through the provision of excellent housing and support services".

Living Later Life to the Full, identifies planning for future housing needs as key to achieving local older people's aspirations for later life, and the need for additional extra care housing is explicit in the Framework.

Active Lives 2006 - 2016' commits to providing innovative schemes that support vulnerable people to live in their own homes. The policy states that the County will continue to lead partnerships to deliver major supported housing projects and identifies public private partnerships as an appropriate vehicle.

Impact/costs and risks of proposed decision

The decision would approve the signing of the PFI Project Agreement, subject to their being no significant changes to the affordability of the deal and the risk profile prior to financial and contractual close.

The current status would commit the Authority to a 25 year contract with a contractor who will design, build, finance and operate at least 220 apartments of extra care and supported housing across five districts. The Authority would receive approximately £66.8 million PFI credits to cover the cost of the project, but would be committed to a contribution towards the operation of the facilities.

The majority of risks associated with developing and running the facilities are borne by the contractor under the PFI arrangement (e.g design risk, demand risk) however some risks such as un-insurability or contract termination are shared and this is set out in detail in the report.



It is proposed to increase charges by 5% this year, this equates to less than 2% per annum since they were last revised.

Most of the charges to developers for supervision of new highway work are calculated as a percentage of the current estimated works costs so these rates do not need to be changed. The charges are broadly in line with those levied by other Highway Authorities.

The Decision needed:

Background and decision

Government has allocated £32.5 million from the Growing Places Fund to the South East Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP). This will create a recyclable fund to pay for infrastructure that will unlock employment and housing delivery.

Following a call for projects in January, the LEP has awarded funding to five projects in Kent, subject to due diligence. These are: A28 Matalan Roundabout (Ashford), EbbsfleetValley/Southfleet Road (Dartford), Dartford Town Centre, Dartford Northern Gateway and the Live Margate housing renewal programme (Thanet). The total value of these schemes is £16 million.

It is proposed that KCC should decide to act as the accountable body in borrowing Growing Places Funding from the central LEP fund to support these schemes, subject to full due diligence.

Links to Bold Steps for Kent and corporate objectives

This decision supports the following priorities in *Delivering Bold Steps*

- Priority 8: Respond to key regeneration challenges, working with our partners
- Priority 9: Support new housing growth that is affordable, sustainable and with the appropriate infrastructure
- Priority 10: Deliver Growth without Gridlock

Impact, costs and risks of proposed decision

Combined, the five Kent schemes approved by the LEP could deliver around 1,600 homes and 1,100 jobs by 2016/17, and would also unlock housing and employment growth in future years.

There main risks are:

Risk of failure to repay funding according to the timetable set out in the

funding agreement

- Risk of non-delivery of housing or employment outputs (including through continuing adverse market conditions)
- Compliance with state aid regulations in using public funding to support the delivery of private sector development schemes

These risks will be fully considered through the due diligence process before proposals are brought for decision.

The main costs will be in monitoring and reporting delivery. It is anticipated that these will be incorporated within the loan agreement.
