Aims and Objectives

Kent County Council has secured funding to enlarge or install new playpark equipment and outdoor seating/picnic areas. The equipment would be funded via the Contain Outbreak Management Fund (COMF) to provide further outdoor provision to help reduce the spread of COVID-19. The budget is circa £1.2m.

The aims of the project are:

1. Having new facilities should encourage people to choose outside activities which should reduce the transmission of COVID when compared to indoor activities.

2. Children and those in deprived areas are more likely to have been impacted by the pandemic. Providing the facilities on their doorstep will help those that have been disproportionately affected by the pandemic.

3. The improvements over winter will ensure there are continued activities that are safe, even if low level restrictions begin to be reintroduced which may prevent families and individuals from attending their usual activities.

4. Individuals that may not have re-engaged with their usual activities since the pandemic began due to feelings of being unsafe (i.e. soft-play, gym, seeing friends and families) will have alternative safer locations to engage in activities.

5. Individuals with excess weight are at greater risk of severe illness from COVID-19. Installing outdoor activities/equipment will help reduce the barriers to helping individuals lose the excess weight.

6. The initiative will also help with Public Health priorities in encouraging exercise and helping families and friends to meet in a COVID-19 safe way that will benefit mental health and child development. Value for money

As the installation of equipment will be permanent, it will provide a lasting benefit long after the pandemic and will continue to contribute towards Public Health priorities and to benefit the community. Many installers offer warranties for their products which will reduce the repair costs for Councils. Where regular maintenance is required for the warranty to remain valid, purchasers should include the requirement to provide regular maintenance within their purchase price.

The playgrounds will be DDA compliant in terms of their accessibility and inclusive design. The surfacing must adhere to standards EN1176 and EN1177.

The aim is to improve the play provision, improve accessibility and improve inclusivity of our existing provision.
