

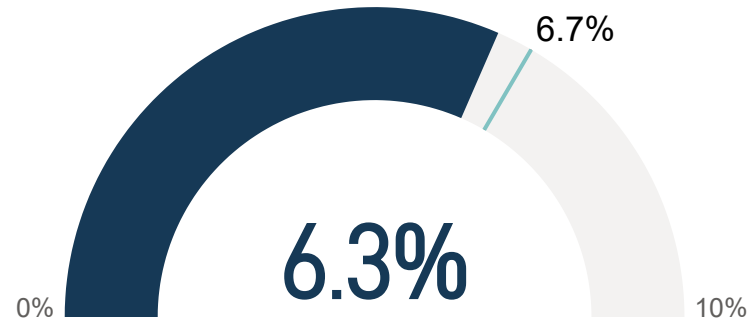

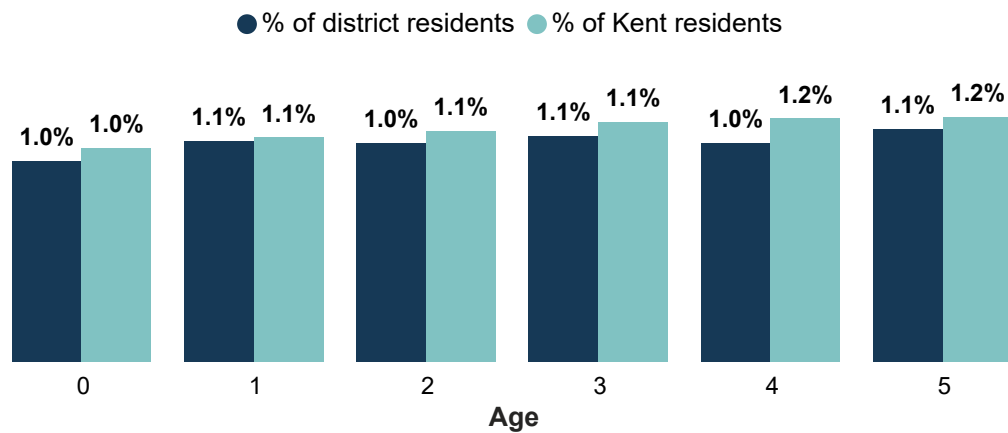

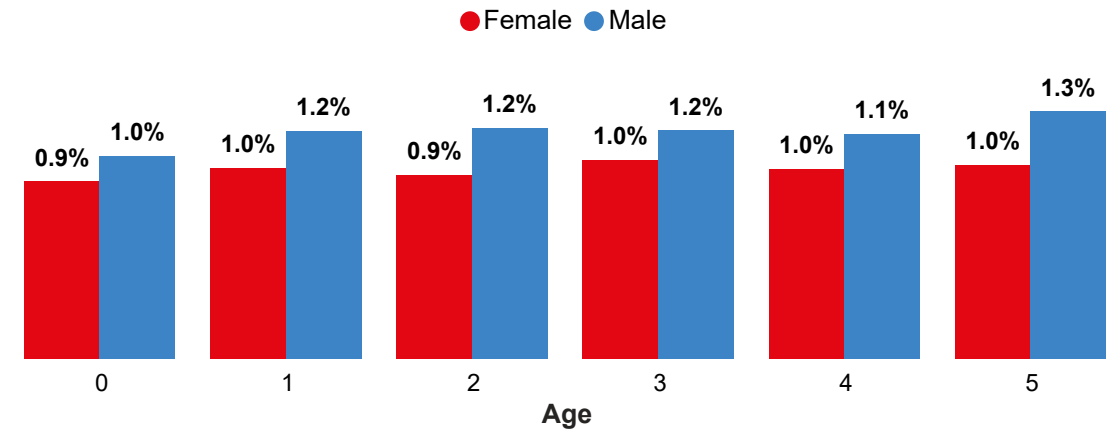

% of Thanet population aged 0-5 by gender and age



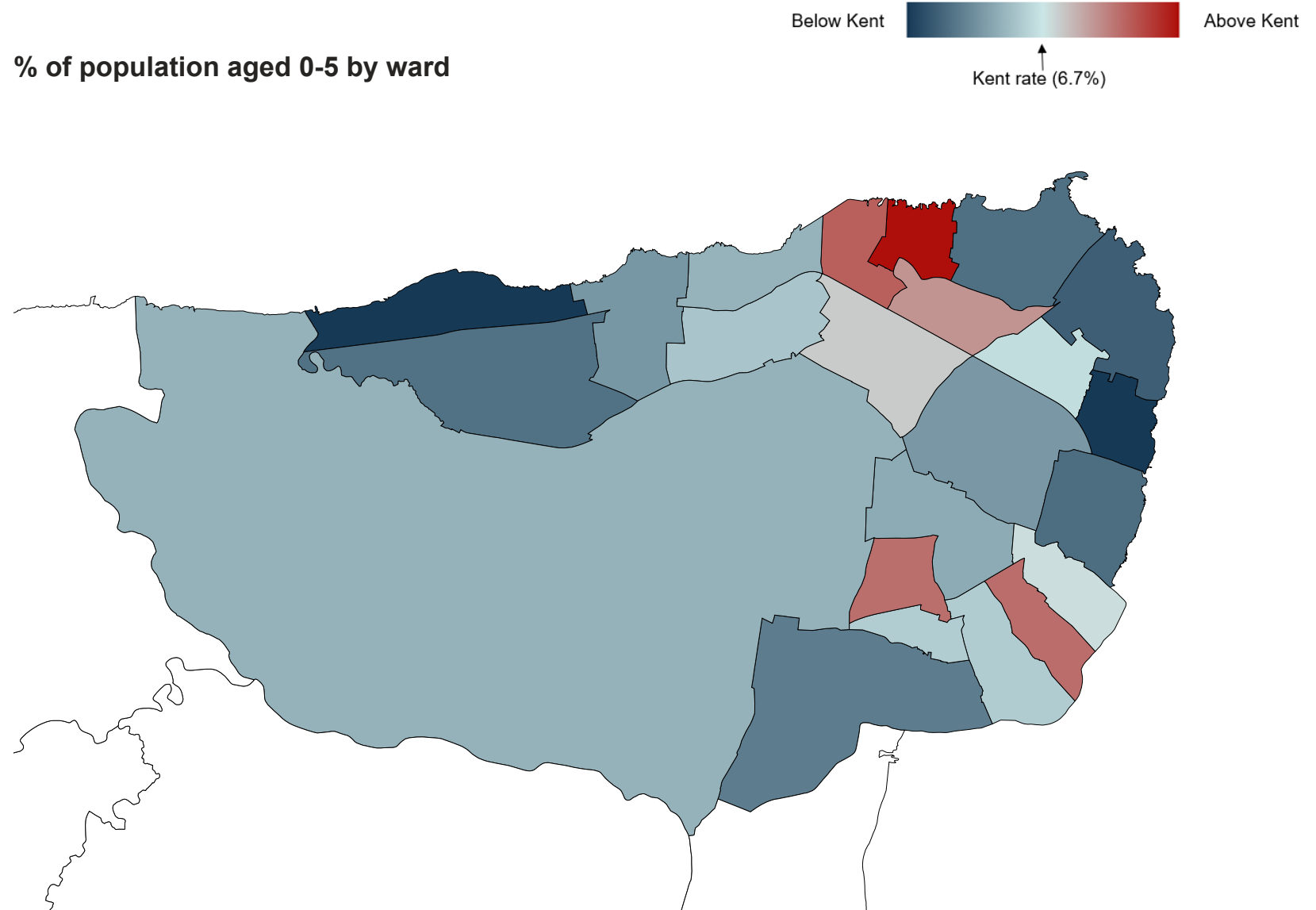

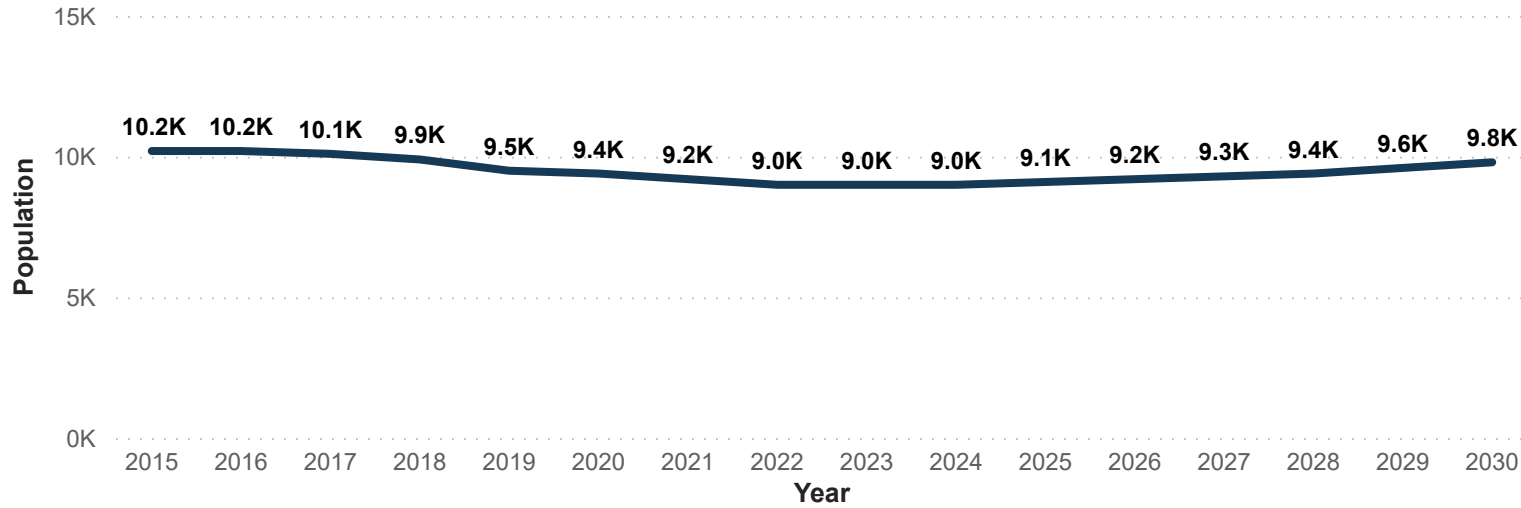

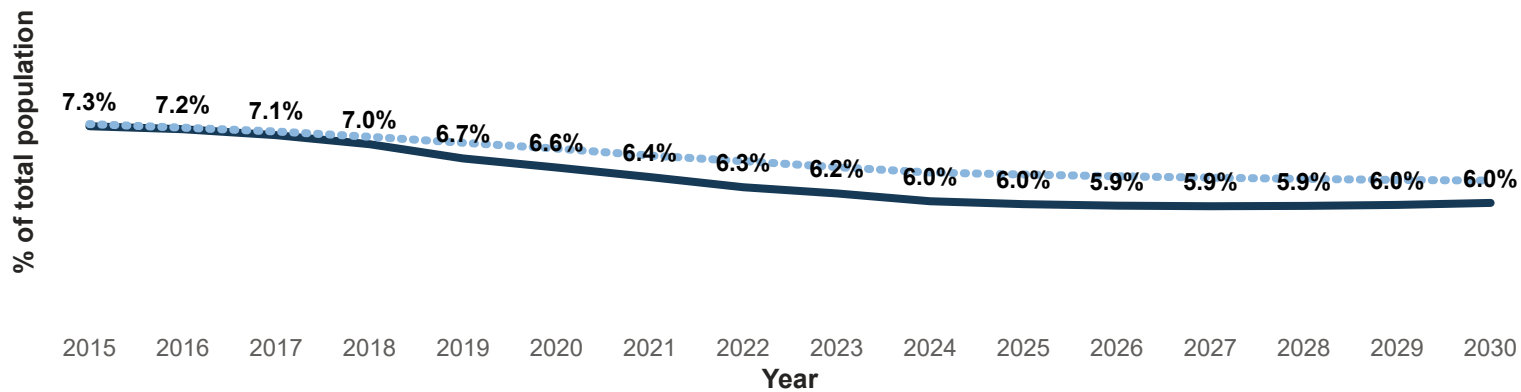

● % of district residents aged 0-5 ● % of Kent residents aged 0-5

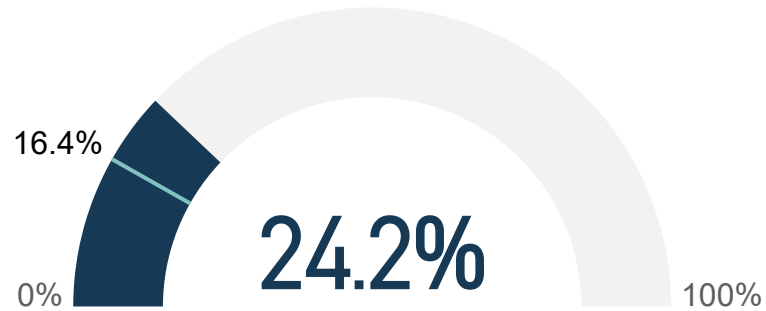

## % of 0-5s living in a relative low-income family in Thanet compared to Kent



The children in low income families (CiLIF) statistics provide information on the number and proportion of children living in Relative and Absolute low income before housing costs (BHC) in the reference year. A family must have claimed one or more of Universal Credit, Tax Credits or Housing Benefit at any point in the year to be classed as low income in these statistics.

In 2021/22, 2,100 children aged 0-5 lived in a relative low-income family in Thanet, which is 24.2% of the 0-5 population in the district. The rate for Kent is 16.4%.

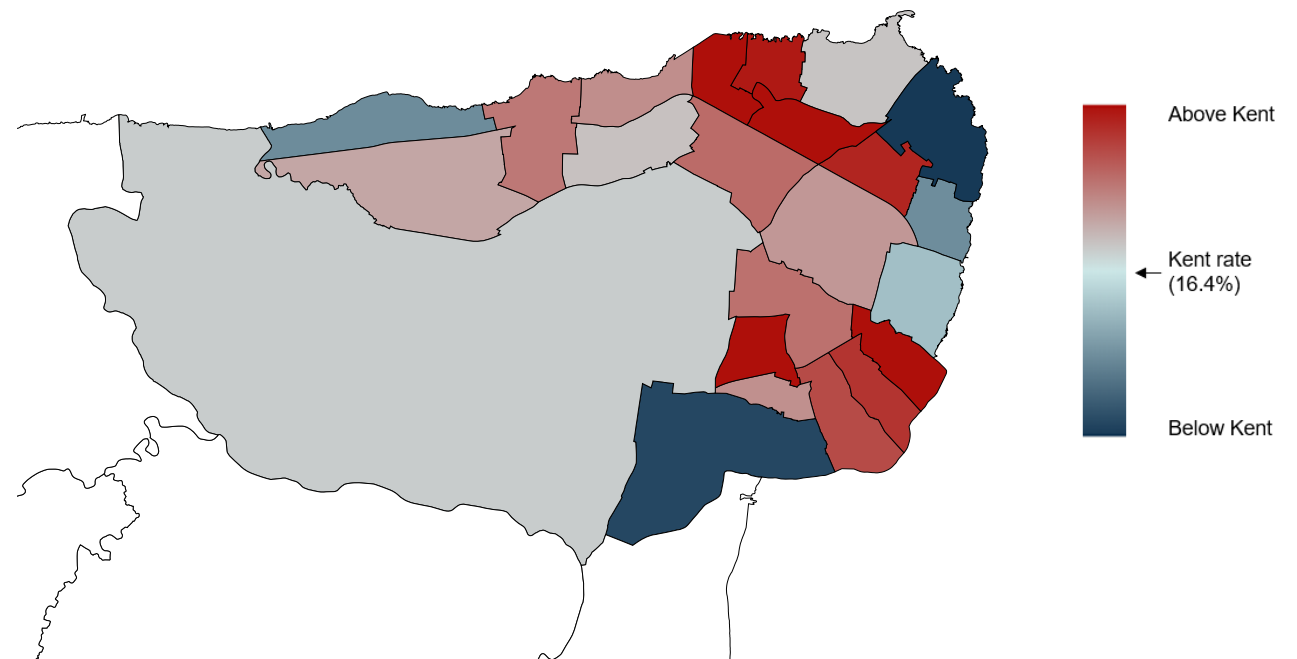

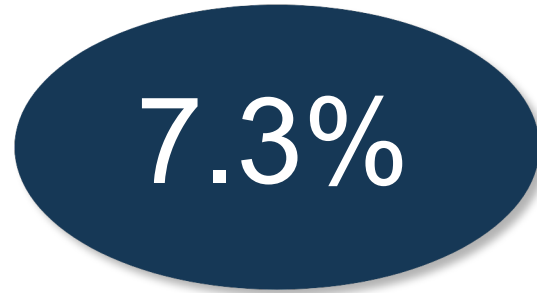

There were 646 children aged 0-5 in Thanet with an Early Help (EH) case in 2021/22, which is a rate of 7.3% of the 0-5 population in the district. This is higher than the Kent rate of 4.8%.

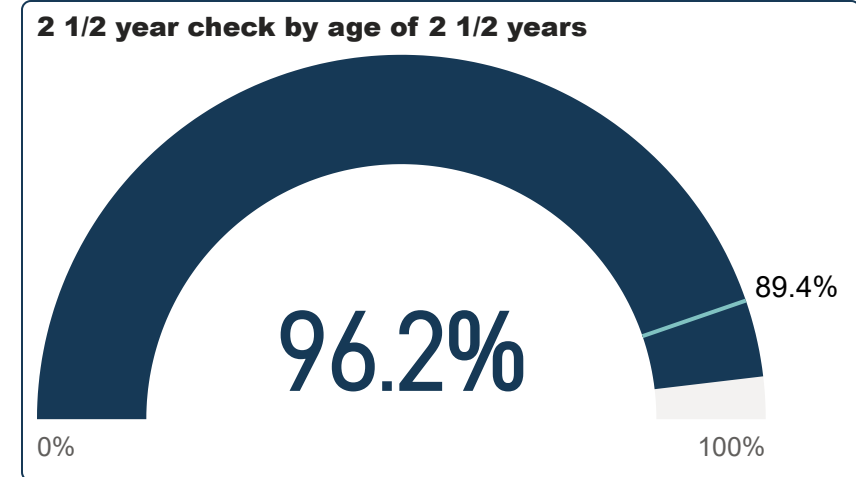
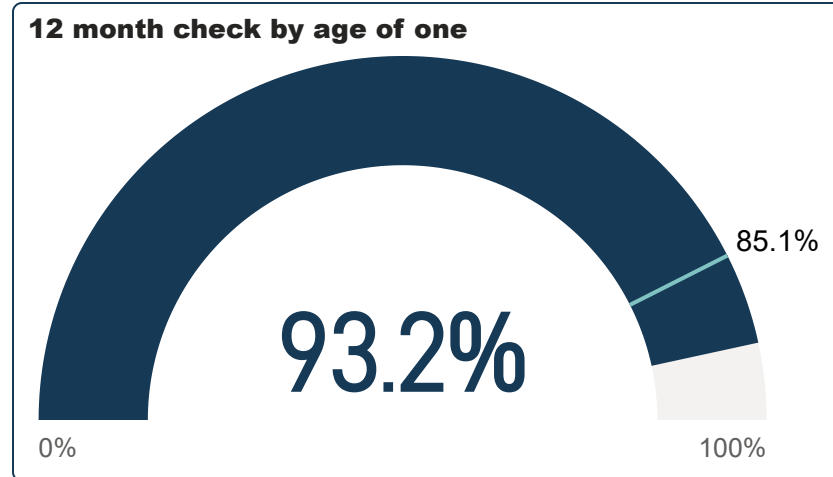
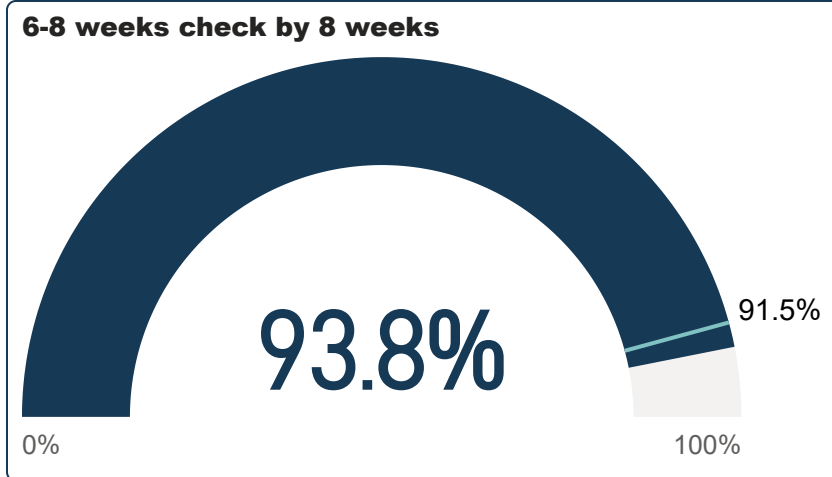
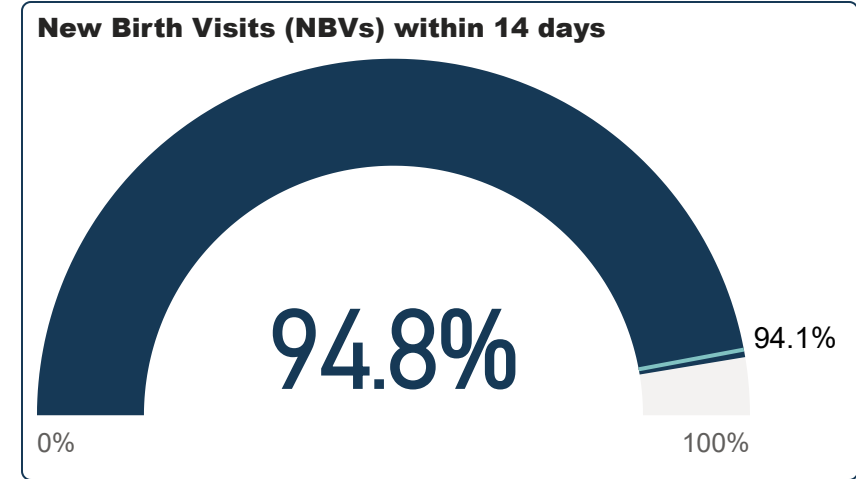
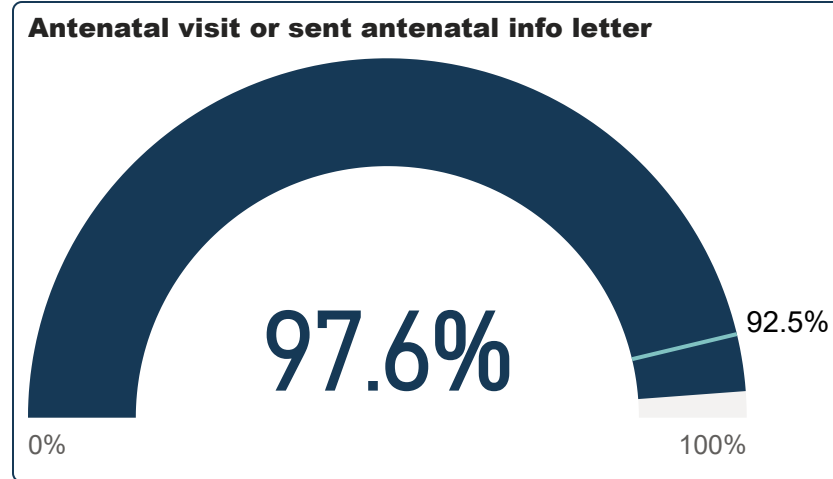
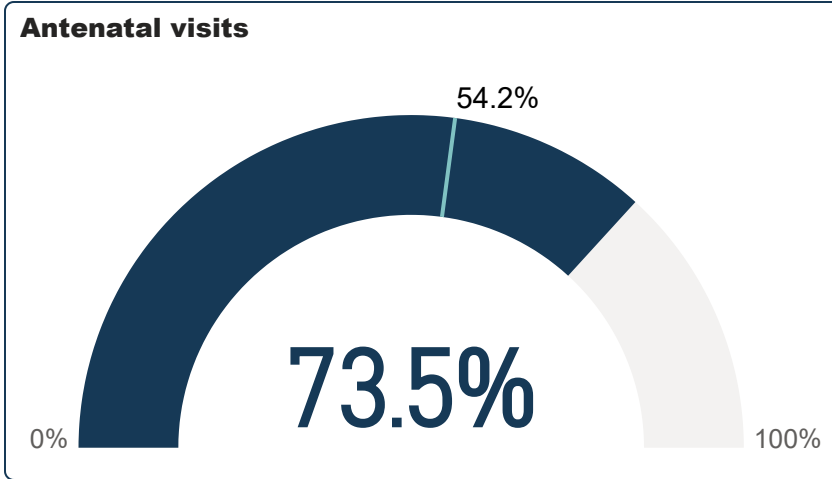
There were 637 children aged 0-5 in Thanet with a social care care or referral in 2021/22, which is a rate of 7.2% of the 0-5 population in the district. This is higher than the Kent rate of 4.9%.

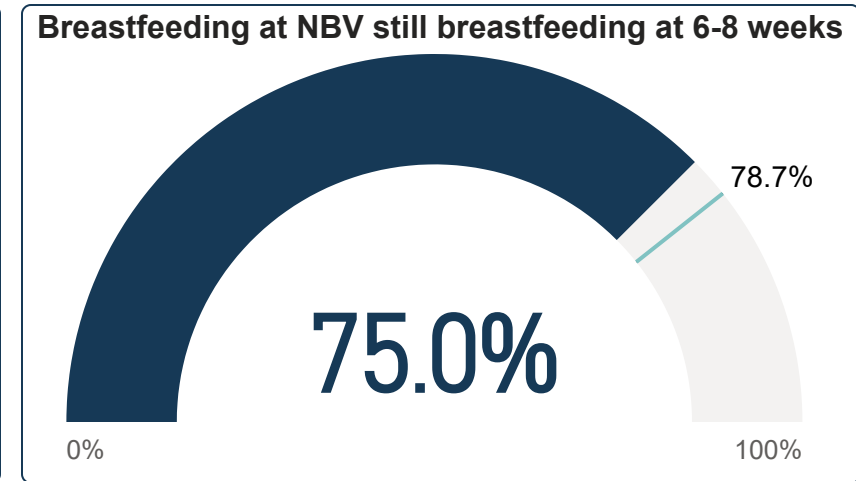
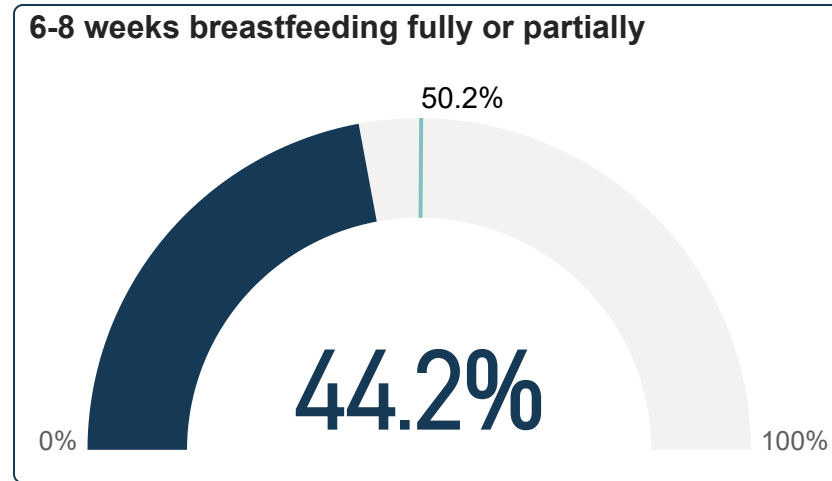
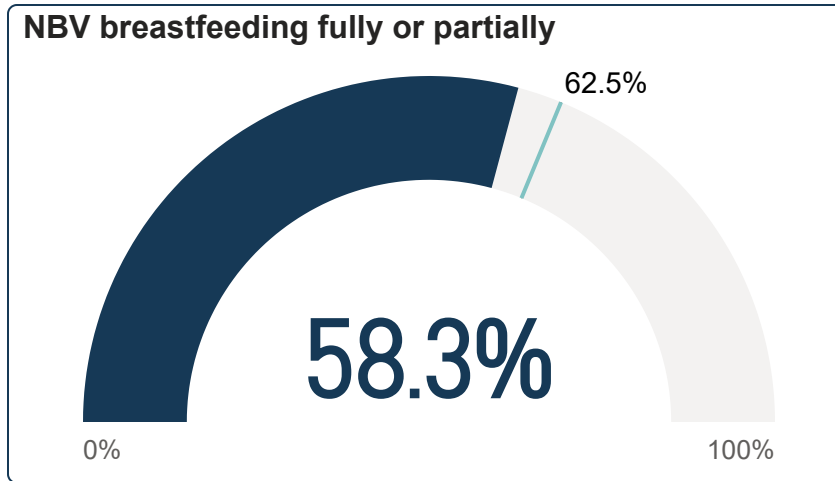

## Healthy Child Clinic rates

There were 627 Healthy Child Clinics held in Thanet in 2021/22. This means that there were 1 clinic held for every 2.2 children aged under 1-years-old\*.

This is a higher rate compared to Kent overall (1 clinic held for every 2.9 children aged under 1-years-old).

## Breastfeeding Groups rates

There were 541 Breastfeeding Groups held in Thanet in 2021/22. This means that there were 1 group held for every 2.5 children aged under 1-years-old\*.

This is a higher rate compared to Kent overall (1 group held for every 8.1 children aged under 1-years-old).

In the 2021/22 academic year, children centres had visits from 1,554 children aged 0-5 who lived in Thanet, which is rate of 17.5% of the 0-5 population in the district. This is higher than the Kent rate of 10.1%.

In total, there were 6,826 visits to children centers in 2021/22 from children aged 0-5 who lived in Thanet.

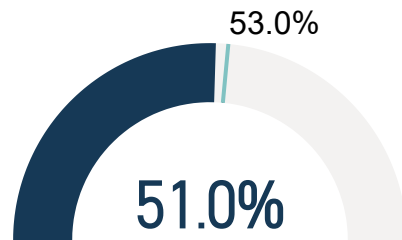

## Overall take-up of free early education by 3 & 4 year olds

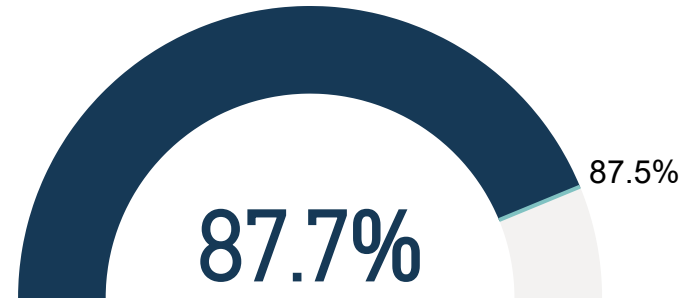

### Free Early Education (FEE)



#### Universal entitlement

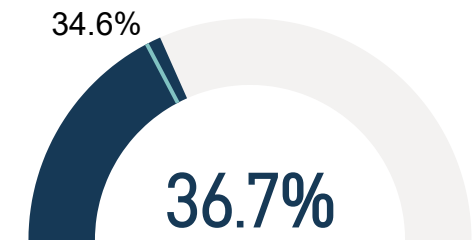
All 3 and 4 year olds are entitled to up to 15 hours of free childcare each week for 38 weeks a year, or fewer hours per week over more weeks of a year (up to 570 hours).



In Thanet in the summer term 2022, 51.0% of 3 and 4 year olds had taken up Free Early Education (FEE) and 36.7% had taken up Extended Funded Entitlement (EFE). Overall take-up was 87.7%.

In comparison, for Kent the take-up rates were 87.5% overall, 53.0% for FEE and 34.6% for EFE.

### Extended Funded Entitlement (EFE)



#### Extended entitlement

Eligible 3 and 4 year olds can receive an extra 15 hours of free childcare each week. Eligibility depends on:

- parent(s) working status
- parent(s) income
- child's age and circumstances
- parent(s) immigration status

Please note that the data does not include children taking up childcare in neighbouring authorities, so take up rates in Dartford and Sevenoaks will be higher than shown in this report.

The childcare sufficiency assessment is based on population forecasts by Edge Analytics and models the required childcare places. This is then compared against the available childcare places.

The most common need type among 0-5 year olds in Thanet is Autistic Spectrum Disorder (58.1%).
